<div>No. 1 Constitutional Amendment Article VII, Section 4; Article XII, Section 42</div> <div>Limitation on the Assessment of Real Property Used for Residential Purposes</div> <div>Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution, effective January 1, 2023, to authorize the Legislature, by general law, to prohibit the consideration of any change or improvement made to real property used for residential purposes to improve the property's resistance to flood damage in determining the assessed value of such property for ad valorem taxation purposes.</div> <div><div>Yes</div><div><input checked="" type="radio"/> No</div></div> <div>No. 2 Constitutional Amendment Article II, Section 5; Article XI, Sections 2 and 5</div> <div>Abolishing the Constitution Revision Commission</div> <div>Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to abolish the Constitution Revision Commission, which meets at 20-year intervals and is scheduled to next convene in 2037, as a method of submitting proposed amendments or revisions to the State Constitution to electors of the state for approval. This amendment does not affect the ability to revise or amend the State Constitution through citizen initiative, constitutional convention, the Taxation and Budget Reform Commission, or legislative joint resolution</div> <div><div>Yes</div><div><input checked="" type="radio"/> No</div></div> <div></div> <div>#VoteTheWholeBallot</div>	<div>No. 3 Constitutional Amendment Article VII, Section 6; Article XII</div> <div>Additional Homestead Property Tax Exemption for Specified Critical Public Services Workforce</div> <div>Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to authorize the Legislature, by general law, to grant an additional homestead tax exemption for nonschool levies of up to \$50,000 of the assessed value of homestead property owned by classroom teachers, law enforcement officers, correctional officers, firefighters, emergency medical technicians, paramedics, child welfare services professionals, active duty members of the United States Armed Forces, and Florida National Guard members. This amendment shall take effect January 1, 2023.</div> <div><div>Yes</div><div><input checked="" type="radio"/> No</div></div> <div><i>This Constitutional Amendment proposed by the State Legislature is designed to prevent County governments from being properly funded through property taxes. While we fully support our first responders, teachers, and military personnel, we believe that support should be demonstrated through better wages and benefits. A yes vote for this amendment would provide that the qualifying period for each election would be set by resolution of the council, reduce the qualifying fee and clarify the requirements to qualify as a candidate. A no vote will reject the amendment.</div> <div><div>Yes</div><div>No</div></div> <div>Charter Amendment Names on Ballots</div> <div>Presently the City Charter provides that if two candidates for city council have the same surname, the ballot shall include the residence address of each candidate. A yes vote for this amendment would remove this requirement and provide that qualified candidate names on the ballot shall be as set forth in the state election code. A no vote will reject the amendment.</div> <div><div>Yes</div><div>No</div></div> <div>Charter Amendment Council Residency Requirement</div> <div>Presently the City Charter does not require a city council candidate to be a resident of the city for a minimum period prior to qualifying as a candidate. A yes vote for this amendment provides that to qualify a candidate must provide documentation that the candidate has been a resident of the city for a minimum of twelve months prior to qualification.
