COLONIAL ACRES PHASE V MINUTES - MAY 12, 2021

The meeting began at 6:05 pm. In attendance were Bill Charles, George Birchmeier, Katy Kay, Cindy Christensen and Susie Brock. Jim Reuschlein represented Clearview Management. The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

- 1. Motion to approve the April Minutes was made by George B. and seconded by Katy K. All approved the motion.
- 2. Motion to approve the Management Report was made by Katy K. and seconded by Cindy C. All approved the motion.
- 3. Motion to approve the Financial Report was made by George B. and seconded by Cindy C. All approved the motion. It was noted that the boiler inspections by Paul will start in the fall.

OLD BUSINESS

- **Motion** to approve Pavlika Building and Remodeling contract for the Clubhouse deck and railings was made by George B. and seconded by Cindy C. The cost is \$43,500. It will take 2 weeks to install and we are selecting a full grain composite wood. All approved motion.
- The majority of the members have received their first keys. We are still expecting keys to arrive in the mail.
- **Motion** to approve Bull Horn lights along Jamestown Dr and the electrical signage installation was made by Cindy C. and seconded by George B. All approved the motion. This project will be done in May and will cost approximately \$9000.
- Motion to install a 1 hp pond fountain with lights and a 150 ft cord was made by George B. Cindy C seconded the motion. All approved the motion. Cost is approximately \$3637.00.
- The pool will be opened May 27, 2021. Jim R. assured us the permit will be available. The Board will revisit the "Member Only" Covid rule each month.
- Jim R. will be getting quotes on different electronic signs to be placed on Jamestown. The budget approved the signs.
- **Motion** to approve Jeffrey Asphalt contract was made by Cindy C. and seconded by Katy K. All approved the motion. The approach to the Clubhouse will also be widened. Hamilton Ct will be repaved and Heritage Blvd to Yorktown also. The cost is \$84,992.00. Sinking drains will be evaluated individually.
- **Phase I-IV** is complaining we are not stopping at the 4 corner stop signs. We will be improving all stop signs heights to make them taller.
- Additions of downspouts will be done in the 3 & Done in the 3 amp; 4 condos this year per Jim R.
- The ballots for the September Board election will be mailed to the Clubhouse. The Clubhouse Chair will collect them, which is Susie B this year. The Nominee Bio's will be mailed to the Newsletter Editor, Gloria P. Gloria P. must receive the Bio's by July 15, 2021. They will not be sent to Bill C. Ballots can also be filled out at the Annual Board meeting. The Board is creating a sub-committee that will count the votes. Remember to only vote for 3 candidates.

- Cindy Christiansen is resigning as Vice President effective immediately. We will need an Interim position (for 1 year) added to September's ballot. We want to thank Cindy. She's been involved with the Board for 12 years. We appreciate her years of service.
- Per Bill C.: Bird feeders and baths are allowed in the courtyard only. No common areas.

NEW BUSINESS

- New Member Orientation will be June 23rd Look for your invite in the mail.
- **We will** be having a Comcast meeting at the Clubhouse. We will have a presentation to explain what Comcast can do. It will not be a time to sign up for coverage.
- **We will** be setting up a sub-committee called Follow Up and Maintenance. This committee will ensure repairs don't fall through the cracks. They will also suggest preventative projects. They will work directly with Jim R.
- **Motion** to approve opening up Coffee to South Lyon dignitaries was made by Susie B. and seconded by Katy K. All approved the motion.
- **Motion** to approve the CPA Audit contract was made by Cindy C. seconded by George B. Cindy C., Katy K. and George B. approved the motion. Susie B. was not present.

BOARD ISSUES

- A motion to increase pool pay to \$40/day for the first 2 weeks was not seconded. Motion did not proceed.
- Garden Club received permission to put a flower bed at 11 Mile entrance. Under the Coffee sign.
- There should be NO garbage cans in the Bus Stop.
- What is the status of the work order Stacy put in for the Camera password?
- Jim R. will install the 11 Mile bench.
- June 9th is the Ladies Luncheon. Call Donna Tilley for details. Please bring a dish to pass.
- June 19th is Volunteer Day at the Clubhouse. Help us clean the Clubhouse. Lunch is provided for Volunteers. There is a Sign Up sheet on the Clubhouse bulletin board.

- 65-6 Questioned about the electric charging stations. (This is being reviewed by the Board)
- **141-5** Spoke about the \$70,200 Comcast Sign Up Bonus. (The money remaining after the Clubhouse Remodel will be put in a separate line account in the Financial report).
- **71-2** Spoke about the vacant condo next to his. Is it moldy? Who owns that condo now? (Jim R. will have it inspected).
- **71-3** Spoke about her Asthma. If the vacant condo is spreading mold, who is going to pair for the repair? (Clearview will).
- **63-3** Spoke about the gutters ruining her deck and bench. The excess water has caused rot. Her ½ wall is missing a strip and cap. Finally there is a tall tree outside her courtyard that is full of bees. (Clearview will fix it).

Welcome to June and hopefully we are putting the pandemic in our rear window. The great news is the State of Michigan has changed the mask mandate. We will follow the State guidelines on mask wearing and not require masks for those that are vaccinated.

The Board at the May meeting approved some major projects to move forward. We approved a contract for the replacement of the clubhouse deck with composite material. This project should be completed sometime in June. Using composite material, we will have extraordinarily little maintenance to perform. The Board also has approved adding additional clubhouse parking lights. These will match the large lights and once installed we will remove the coach lights along the pond. The coach lights are getting old and in some instances are not safe. As part of this project, they will extend the power to the curb on Heritage Blvd north of the Clubhouse entrance. The plan is to install a digital information sign for the Clubhouse and general information for our members. Asphalt paving of Heritage Blvd, from the curve by the clubhouse to Yorktown Drive, will be accomplished this month. There will be some disruption as this project is completed.

New members, if you receive an invite, there will be a new member orientation June 23rd at 6:30pm. This is a great opportunity to hear from and ask questions of your Board of Directors, our Management Firm, and others on what it means to be living in Colonial Acres Phase V, a cooperative community.

The Porcupine Mountains, often called "the Porkies," are certainly one of Michigan's most lovely hidden gems. Whether you're hiking the Escarpment Trail or admiring Lake of the Clouds, you're sure to have a beautiful journey through this region.
- **5. Air Zoo (Portage)** Explore this Portage aeronautics museum when you're looking for a truly out-of-this-world experience. Step onto a flight simulator, peruse a wide array of historical airplanes, or simply marvel at the many artifacts and exhibits that make this locale so unique. No matter what your age, you'll be impressed!
- **Turnip Rock (Port Austin)** If you're looking to explore a unique geological formation, Turnip Rock is the spot for you! Grab your kayak & paddle out from the charming town of Port Austin, which sits just meters from this one-of-a-kind rock. Be sure to bring your (waterproof) camera. this is one of the most visually interesting spots in the entire state of Michigan.
- 7. Motown Museum and Hitsville, USA (Detroit) If you're a fan of Stevie Wonder, Diana Ross, or Aretha Franklin, you can thank the Great Lakes State, particularly Detroit for giving rise to your favorite artists. - 8. Soo Locks (Sault Ste. Step back in time with a journey to Fort Mackinac, which originally served as a British military outpost following its founding in 1782. Concerts in McHattie Park are coming back this summer. They will start in July & be from 7 to 8:30. The schedule has not come out yet, watch this space!





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


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
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
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






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


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
