## Pastor's Portion

Joy may be the one-word summary of Philippians. The word "joy" appears 203 times in the ESV and 5 times in the book of Philippians. "Rejoice" appears 233 times in the ESV with 7 of them in the 4 chapters of Philippians. Most scholars think the primary purpose of the book is Paul saying "thank you" to the believers in Philippi for the sacrificial gift. Entwined with his gratefulness is this theme of joy. Let's take a look at Paul's letter.

Paul launches his letter with joy in his prayer. Every time he prays for them (Philippians 1:4) he does so with joy. He makes it clear that joy is not because things are going his way. The example Paul shares of rejoicing in being maligned is eye opening. He can "rejoice" while being maligned because the gospel is being proclaimed. His sense of joy is in Jesus not his reputation.

There are reasons for the joy Paul has in the believers. It is because they gave a gift to him (4:10). He is pleased and joyful because of their growth in faith (1:25). Joy can also be because a sick brother was restored to them (2:29). Finally, he finds joy in their being united in serving the Lord (2:2). However, he also says that his joy may not be complete (2:2) because of lack of unity and singleness of purpose.

Two final thoughts I have:

- 1). Joy can be commanded. That is contrary to our present state of psychosis. The modern state says how can you crank up joy? But Paul says we are to rejoice five different times (2:18; 2:29; 3:1; 4:4).
- 2) Biblical joy is rooted in the relationship with Jesus Christ. Paul emphasizes the joy is *IN THE LORD* (4:4) and proclaiming the gospel (1:18). I suspect that reminding the saints their prize in the by and by (3:14) and citizenship being in heaven (3:20) enables Paul to say all this on earth is worth the struggle.
