Elly called 911 and Peter stayed and helped my precious one and me. (Charlie wanted to get up and walk around. It took two of us to calm him down.)

Soon the ambulance and EMT's were here and took over. We took off for Mercy Hospital in lowa City and checked in.

The EKG proved negative, but the blood work showed he had had a "small" heart attack.

To me a heart attack is a heart attack and I want action - luckily I have Peter and Elly as a support team to take over.

They were going to run tests Saturday morning so Peter took off work and stayed with his father.


Naturally, no tests... so stay though Saturday and Sunday night.

BUILD A 2022 'INFLATION FIGHTER BUDGET'

Many families have noticed that the items they buy on a day-to-day basis have gradually increased in price over the past year.

The Consumer Price Index measures the change in prices paid by urban consumers for goods and services. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the December 2021 CPI rose by 7% over the past 12 months — the largest 12-month increase in 40 years. This index measures the average change over time in the cost of food, housing, gasoline, utilities, household items, and other goods or services.

"You can use The Consumer Price Index Inflation alculator to help you build your personal inflation fighter budget. It's a valuable tool to better understand the current and future impact of inflation," Ehlers said. The average Midwest family of three in the Bureau of Labor Statistics example needed \$350 more per month to meet their expenses. If the income for the family does not increase by \$350 per month, the family will have less buying power. Each family needs to decide what changes to make to their budget. Give attention to expense categories like, housing, recreation, internet or phone. The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau's "Cutting Expenses Tool" provides tested strategies to decrease expenses for fighting inflation. Establish an inflation fighter budget with some help. Free financial education consultations are available to all Iowa residents from ISU Extension and Outreach's human sciences specialists.
