

**Minutes
Longview Neighborhood Association Annual Meeting
May 2, 2016**

Meeting held at Twin Lakes Park for all families who own property in the Longview Neighborhood. Dinner began at 5:30 PM provided by the Association.

At 6:10 PM the meeting was called to order by outgoing President, Mike Quinata, who opened the meeting with thanks to the 'out-going' officers. He then made several announcements:

- a. Neighborhood Watch Training to be held at 2612 Gabrianna, on May 17 at 7:00 PM.
- b. LNA Garage Sale will be on Saturday, May 14th.
- c. LNA Yard Sign Policy: No political signs allowed except for 2 weeks prior to election, and must be taken down 1 day after election.

'Out-going' President Mike Quinata then introduced 'In-coming' President Larry Purvis, who carried the meeting forward from this point.

Attendance: 40 adults & 9 children. List of those in attendance is attached (sign-in list).

1. **Minutes** of the last annual meeting were distributed to those present. Motion to approve minutes was made by Jim Scott, seconded by Larry Purvis. Motion passed.
2. **Treasurer's Report** was distributed and presented by Jim Chipman. Motion to approve report was made by Jim Scott, seconded by Chuck Worstell. Motion passed.
3. **By-Laws Modification:** Larry read the proposed modification: "**LNA homeowners are eligible to vote in the Election of Officers and be elected to the Board as an Officer only if the LNA home-owner is current on their annual dues.**" Charles Black made the motion to accept this modification; Mike Quinata seconded the motion. Motion passed by 100% of those present via a voice vote.
4. **Elections:** Nominations announced by Larry and opened the floor for any additional nominations.
 - a. **Vice-President:** Joe Kelly & Donna Breedlove were nominated. Each nominee was then given an opportunity to introduce themselves to the member present. Ballots were then distributed, and a vote was taken. Joe Kelly was elected by a majority.
 - b. Bill Dye was nominated for the ACC, and was elected by acclamation.
5. **Meeting opened for public comment:** Ed Skrabal requested that everyone in the neighborhood "watch their speed" when driving in Longview. Speed bumps were not a viable option since they presented a problem for the city with snow plowing; but this can still be a problem if each member does not carefully watch their speed.
