Creamers by Bonnie Theard



The April meeting program featured 24 of the 36 creamers in the collection of Bonnie and Harold Theard. Fourteen were of Depression Glass patterns: Pink--Cherry Blossom, Mayfair, and Miss America (also Elegant Glass, a Cambridge pattern in pink); Green--Floral, Horseshoe, Princess, Madrid; Amber--Sharon; Yellow--Lorain and Florentine #2; Crystal--Heritage and Duncan Miller Teardrop, and an unknown pattern; and Blue--Madrid.

Eleven creamers were china from Royal Doulton, Hall, Iroquois, Pickard China, Sadler, D.H. Holmes, and The Pantry Parade. One plastic creamer, the Moo Cow Creamer, was a souvenir of the couple's honeymoon in 1972.
