Community Partnership Program Summary

- ▶ Meeting held Nov 9 at NWFSC
- ▶ Air Force CPP update
 - SAF/IE Commitment: this is an enduring requirement; “refresh” new leaders/staff every 2 years or as requested
 - Participation: 51 installations/communities
 - Initiatives: 114 implemented agreements; 300 priority initiatives actively being worked
 - 10 USC 2679 facilitates state/local agreements—anticipate AF-wide use
- ▶ Current successes (next slide)

Community Partnership Program Summary

- ▶ **Completed agreement:** Hanscom AFB–Bedford where town to provide proactive salt brine application at lower cost to AF; increased safety and reduced environmental impacts
- ▶ **Intergovernmental Support Agreements in development:** Civil Engineer training; refuse and recycling; cooperative purchasing; pavement marking and striping
- ▶ **In work:** Joint firing ranges – shared cost between AFBs and local governments to construct new facility (O&M, lease, MILCON)
- ▶ **Developing templates:** Joint use airfield, water/wastewater, shared golf course, transition assistance, and training
- ▶ **Guidance/Templates:** SAF/IEI and SAF/AQC IGSA policy memo (24 Aug 15); 10 USC 2679 Q&A on APAN; BCA outline/template; AFCP MOU template on APAN




1. **Purpose:** This agreement is designed to sustain the exemplary Air Force Community Partnerships known as P4 (Public-Public and Public-Private) Initiatives. One of these initiatives focuses on promoting flexibility, inclusiveness, and information-sharing that lead to meaningful career support for transitioning service members and military spouses.
2. **Scope:** This agreement is adopted by CareerSource Okaloosa Walton, the 96th Test Wing at Eglin Air Force Base and the 1st Special Operations Wing at Hurlburt Field as a vehicle to collaborate, create and preserve jobs for transitioning service members and to connect them to career opportunity and training services. Execution of this Military Member Reemployment P4 Initiative will pave the way for improved opportunities and services. We will continue to collectively pursue funding, such as the Florida Defense Support Task Force grants.
3. **Commitment:** CareerSource Okaloosa Walton, Eglin Air Force Base, and Hurlburt Field look forward to executing this P4 Initiative project thereby expanding opportunities for transitioning service members and military families.
