Minister's Reflection - Summer 2021

These four questions were laid out at the beginning of this book: Where do I come from? Where am I going? Why am I here? Who am I?

All children, regardless of their racial or socio-economic backgrounds need to know the answers to these questions. They need to know who their ancestors are, who their heroes and villains are; they need to know about their family's traditions and cultures and the community they are a part of. Our children must feel that they are loved, valued, and worthy members of society who belong in this world exactly as they are.

As Thomas King said, "But don't say in the years to come that you would have lived your life differently if only you had heard this story. You've heard it now." (The Truth About Stories)

As I write this, another 182 unmarked graves have been uncovered at the former St. Eugene Mission Residential School, near Cranbrook BC and the Ktunaxa Nation. This brings the total to 1325 unmarked identified graves and It has been a counting. tough few weeks for Canada, for the church, especially for the Indigenous community who traumatized all over again with each announcement. We grieve with them, at this senseless loss of young lives, in such cruel and inhumane ways that the church felt it needed to be covered up. It can make one question the

church, God, and humanity.

The reality is that God did not have anything to do with this abuse and death. God grieved with the children and the community. lt important for those of us who are non-Indigenous to allow space for this grief and not to be asking things of those we know who are Indigenous, other than to offer support and love. It is educate up to us to ourselves, hear the stories and read and learn about the truth. If you haven't read the 94 TRC Calls to Action, take some time to read them. Or if you prefer to watch videos, Reconciliation Thunder has

made videos for each call and are offering new videos for 94 days before Sept 30, starting June 29. There are many books that tell the stories of Indigenous experience, take time over the summer to read Take in a powwow or one. other indigenous cultural celebrations to experience and learn about the culture. The people are very welcoming. We hope to organize going to the Treaty Four Powwow in September with Indigenous Christian Fellowship, which would be the second week of September. As these announcements of more unmarked graves continue over the coming months and possibly years, may we be able to continue to be sensitive to grief and pain each will announcement cause among Indigenous people, so that we can stand with them, continuing to honour the children and not numb ourselves to the news or ignore the reality. In light of

the Thomas King quote above, may we begin to live our lives differently, having heard the stories and go about learning the truths.

In the midst of this we are also moving through a time of transition as we hope to see things open up after 15 months of living in pandemic. This means that come the fall, we hope to be in person for worship and our ministry programming. As we do SO, we honour the different comfort levels people will have. As such some of us will continue to be wearing masks and we will encourage physical distancing as we worship in the West Sanctuary. We will continue to offer worship online for those who wish to stay home and for those who join us from out of town. This is part of our new normal. As we move through this time, may we do so with grace and

compassion for wherever people's comfort levels are at, knowing that we are all a community of God, and that God is with us in this transition, as God has been with us through these challenging times.

May you have a blessed summer filled with rest, renewal, and wonderful visits with family and friends whom you may not have seen for a while!



Faithful Climate Conversations

As we live into the crisis of climate change and experience more and more the impacts of this crisis this resource encourages dialogue on climate change. For the Love of Creation developed Faithful Climate Conversations, a series of guides to facilitate small group conversations on climate change. There are three sessions and folk may participate in all or the ones that suit them and where they are at. If you are interested in participating in any of these conversations, let Russell or the office know, along with which one(s) and we will schedule them. The three sessions are:

- 1) **Creation, Climate and You** Designed for people who have rarely, if ever, talked about climate change in a group setting before, this guide focuses on gently surfacing peoples' emotions and underlying thoughts about climate change.
- 2) **From Concern to Action** For people who may have a basic understanding of climate change or are concerned about the effects of climate change, but remain uncertain about the best ways to act in light of this reality.
- 3) **Build a Better Future** Meant for people who have already been involved in climate action at some level, this guide focuses on enacting political and systemic change to address the climate emergency.

This resource has been developed by a coalition of organizations including Kairos.
