

DIVORCE LAW IN HAWAI'I 2018 CALENDAR

The Family Court's monthly Divorce Law in Hawai'i public education program at the Supreme Court begins its 17th year in January 2018. Started in 2002 as a companion to the Family Court's Kids First program, Divorce Law in Hawai'i covers custody, property division, child support and alimony, the difference between a contested divorce and uncontested divorce, all the ways to settle a divorce, and additional resources available to divorcing spouses.

William C. Darrah, Esq., an attorney in private practice, addresses the law and process of divorce, divorce settlement options, and ways to resolve a divorce with a minimum of conflict and expense. Tracey Wiltgen, Esq., the executive director of the Mediation Center of the Pacific, describes mediation as a divorce settlement option, and what happens in a divorce mediation at MCP.

Divorce Law in Hawai'i is presented in the Hawai'i Supreme Court courtroom on the second floor of Ali'iolani Hale (makai of the statue of King Kamehameha and across the street from Iolani Palace), 417 S. King St., Honolulu, Hawai'i. The presentation begins at noon, and lasts for an hour.
