

# Gaming News

### Big time tournamentpoker players

The website PrimeCasino analyzed the player rankings at HendonMob. com, the world's largest poker-player database, to determine the total (inflation-adjusted) earnings of tournament-poker players worldwide. The player with the most earnings is Bryn Kenney, a 38-year-old from Long Beach. New York: his first cash was in 2007 and since then, he's won \$67 million. After Kenney are Jason Bonomo (U.S., \$64.1 million), Stephen Chidwick (England, \$59.2 million), Jason Koon (U.S., \$58 million), and Mikita Bodyakovsky (Belarus, \$55.6 million). Canadian Daniel Negreanu placed seventh (\$53.9 million) and Erik Seidel 10th (\$47 million). Phil Ivey, Phil Hellmuth, Doyle Brunson, Sammy Farha, Tom Dwan, and other big-name players weren't even in the top ten. Which goes to show that Hendon Mob tracks live-poker tournament results only, not online poker or cash games, where the real money is. The highest-earning woman tournament player is Vanessa Selbst,

a 40-year-old native of Brooklyn with just under \$12 million.

# Vegas Sphere declares loss

Sphere Entertainment Company announced third-quarter results for 2024 with a loss of \$125.1 million. In the earnings call, Sphere executives admitted to shortcomings in bookings, marketing, and sales, though hinted that a number of new shows are on the horizon. And speaking of the horizon, Sphere last week announced that a second version of the arena will be built in Abu Dhabi in the United Arab Emirates; it's slated to open in 2030.

### Odds vs. polls

At least over the past three presidential elections, the betting markets told the tale, while most of the political polls got it wrong. Most of the major polls predicted a Harris win by a thin margin, while Ipsos and the Economist gave her a larger edge at 56%. The betting markets were opposite. Trump was a consistent favorite, dipping briefly into dog territory after his debate with Harris,

but flipping back to the forefront at odds between -145 and -168 in the runup, then rising into the stratosphere on Election Day: -225 by the time the first polls closed, -320 an hour later, then -2500 (BetMGM in Ontario) by 8 p.m. Eastern. It seems to be common sense that looking at the two different models, gamblers putting their money—and sometimes big money—where their beliefs are trumps, so to speak, surveying thousands of randomly selected citizens online or over the phone with an interviewer.

### Hard Rock grand opening

The Hard Rock Hotel & Casino Bristol, in Virginia, opened the doors to its permanent home this past fall. Country music star Blake Shelton performed at the casino's entertainment venue to celebrate its grand opening. The permanent casino features almost 1,500 slot machines, more than 50 table games, dining options and more. The hotel includes 303 rooms, a Hard Rock Cafe, stores and a 2,000-seat music venue. Hard Rock International Chairman Jim Allen said Bristol is the perfect spot for this facility.

# Big winners at Palace Station

Some lucky guests playing Bingo at Palace Station in Las Vegas recently hit some of the casino's largest progressive jackpots. According to Station Casinos, one person visiting from out of town won the Palace Station bingo progressive of \$64,936 after covering all 48 numbers. And just a day prior, a local had hit the Station Casinos Jumbo Bingo progressive for \$159,791. The winner hit the 51st number, 21, and was the single winner. Both big winners chose to remain anonymous.

# Young women bringing Bingo back

Millennials and Gen Z are flocking to a new take on an old pastime, where karaoke, drinks and Dirty Dancing take place alongside traditional Bingo, making for raucous good fun. Rank Group, owner of Mecca Bingo, which has 52 venues across the UK, said 44 per cent of its new customers in the past year were under 35 years old. And Buzz Bingo, which operates 82 clubs, said around half of its 200,000 new visitors in the year to January were under 35 years old. Gen Z-those born between 1997 and 2012-have also been drawn into the fold. Many bingo clubs had to close their doors in Britain since 2020, says Miles Baron, chief executive of the Bingo Association, due to a combination of the pandemic and the spike in energy prices following it. But the young ladies are bringing Bingo back. Younger people-mostly women-come because it's "authentic, it's safe, 80 per cent of the attendees are female, unlike pubbing or clubbing. You don't have to dress up to go, but you can if you want to. And it's multi-generational," he says.

# UK Caller of the Year

A woman has been named the national bingo caller of the year after only working in the industry for two years. Issy-Mae Hunt, 21, who is originally from Ipswich, began working for Buzz Bingo after a friend encouraged her to join the team. After working in Ipswich, she moved to Derby to carry on her work and was entered into the National Game Bingo Caller of the Year competition. She was awarded

the title during an awards ceremony in Wakefield, which she said left her family and friends in tears. She told BBC Radio Suffolk she wore a hotdog outfit during her trial for the job in Derby, which helped her stand out. For the Bingo Caller of the Year competition, entrants from bingo clubs across the country were evaluated on their knowledge of the game, their calling skills and showmanship. Ms. Hunt added an extra element to impress the judges. "I played the ukulele and I made my own original cover song," she explained. "I did a spin of my journey through bingo-it was a cute little song and I showed a video, it was really cool."

# Celeb sighting at Bingo

Samuel L Jackson made a surprise appearance recently at Bongo's Bingo nightclub in Glasgow, Scotland. The night club host spoke of his "surreal" and "crazy" experience seeing Samuel L Jackson on a Friday night. The Hollywood icon, 74, was spotted on stage at Bongo's Bingo, "throwing glow sticks at the crowd" and getting front-row seats to watch a dance performance. "I look over to the right and he's just onstage dancing, enjoying himself, taking a few videos and taking in the crowd," Bongo's Bingo host, said.

DEAR PAWS: My next-door neighbor puts out food for all of the outdoor cats in the area. That includes a lot of strays who are now mingling with the cats who have homes. She even buys specialty cat food if she thinks they don't like what she's offering. I think this is a dangerous situation, because the cats may be exposed to diseases from the strays. What should I say to her to stop this? — Concerned Next Door

DEAR NEXT DOOR: If you're on polite terms with the neighbor, talk to her about the issue, calmly. Explain your concerns and let her know that some of those cats have homes and owners who may not be happy about their cats being fed somewhere else.

If you have a neighborhood HOA, bring up the issue in a community meeting. The cats' owners may not be aware of what's going on. If you don't have an HOA, try discussing the issue with the other owners directly. Explain that their cats are at risk of contracting diseases common among strays, like FIV (feline immunodeficiency virus) or could be injured in a territorial fight. The least painful solution is for cat owners to keep their outdoor cats inside and away from the neighbor.

Then contact your local animal control. Now, animal control doesn't always intervene in these situations, but if they feel that the strays are a danger to other pets, they may come out and try to trap and remove them to a shelter, or at least have a talk with your neighbor about putting food out.

# **Operation Gratitude**

Since it began in 2003, Operation Gratitude has sent out in excess of 4 million care packages to deployed service members. Starting several years ago, OpGrat has expanded their range of giving to include first responders, wounded heroes, recruit graduates coming out of boot camp and veterans, saying thank you to those who serve.

The kids aren't left out either. Over 20,000 Battalion Buddy teddy bears have been send to military children in one year.

The donated items in the boxes (ranging from expensive gadgets to snacks to games to necessities) come

from corporations, small companies, community and civic groups, and individuals.

Requesting a care package to be sent to someone is easy. Packages can be sent to Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps and Coast Guard personnel deployed overseas and National Guard serving domestically.

Volunteers are at the heart of OpGrat. They write letters to be included in the packages and volunteer at the packing events. Local groups create handmade items, scout troops and companies hold fundraisers and schoolchildren collect loose change.

I first wrote about Operation Gratitude in 2008 and have been tracking them through the years. While other efforts have come and gone, OpGrat has only grown and expanded. One memorable highlight was the year founder Carolyn Blashek personally delivered a care package to a soldier in Iraq. That box contained the keys to a new vehicle, courtesy of the automaker.

### Hi Anthony,

Sounds like it was quite a show. I feel bad for that poor woman. She must have been mortified.

To the best of my knowledge, there is no reason a person can't collect used Bingo paper for home use. In fact, over the years I've seen letters in the Bingo Bugle from people who have written in about craft projects they've done with old daubers, dauber caps, Bingo paper, etc.

I can only guess that there was a specific incident that this Bingo chairman experienced which resulted in his policy on recycling all Bingo paper. (FYI – State regulations govern the playing of Bingo, but individual halls can and do have additional in-house rules.) Perhaps a player tried to reuse Bingo paper at another game. Maybe he heard that someone used old Bingo paper at another hall. Maybe he experienced someone cutting out numbers and pasting them onto losing cards to fake a win. (I actually did hear of that happening once.)

This is likely going to remain a Bingo hall mystery until someone gathers up the courage to approach the Bingo chairman when he is in a better mood and ask him. I'd sure like to know!

### Ask Annie

### Wok it out

### Dear Ask Annie,

I love to stir-fry with the wok my husband gave me for my birthday. Do you have a favorite stir-fry recipe? Will you share it with me? Thanks a lot! — **Belinda from Baltimore** 

### Dear Belinda,

I found this recipe many years ago in a cookbook given to me by a dear friend. I hope you like it as much as my family did. I would suggest serving large tortilla wraps with this entree. Rice goes nicely, too. This meal was always a favorite with my bunch. Prepare the sauce first, then the beef dish. — **Annie** 

### ALL-PURPOSE STIR-FRY SAUCE

6 tablespoons soy sauce

- 2 teaspoons finely chopped, peeled fresh ginger
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 small or 1 large green onion, finely chopped
- 1 teaspoon red pepper flakes
- 1 teaspoon peanut, canola or sunflower oil

In a small bowl, combine all of the above ingredients. Stir well. Makes about 1/2 cup.


### BEEF, ASPARAGUS AND RED BELL PEPPERS

- 6 tablespoons peanut or vegetable oil
- 1 pound fresh asparagus spears
- $2 \ pounds \ flank \ steak$
- 2 large red bell peppers
- ½ cup cornstarch dissolved in 6 table-spoons water
- ½ cup All-Purpose Stir Fry Sauce

Trim the asparagus, cut on a diagonal into 1.5-inch lengths; about three cups. Parboil them in boiling water for 2 minutes, drain, rinse in cold water and drain again. Slice the flank steak in half horizontally and then cut into thin strips about 2 inches long and 1/4 inch wide. Remove the seeds from the red peppers, de-rib the peppers and cut into strips 2 inches long and 1/2 inch wide.

In a large wok, over high heat, warm 2 tablespoons of the oil, swirling to coat the bottom and sides of the pan. When the oil is very hot, add the asparagus and stir and toss every 10 to 15 seconds for 2 minutes. Set aside. Add 2 more tablespoons of the oil to the wok, cook the beef in the same manner for 2 minutes. It might be necessary to do the beef in several batches. Add extra oil as needed. Set the beef aside.

Do the same with the red peppers. With the beef and red peppers returned to the wok, quickly stir in the cornstarch liquid and add it to the pan along with the stir-fry sauce. Cook, tossing the mixture occasionally until the sauce thickens. Return the asparagus to the wok, toss to coat evenly with the sauce and serve immediately. Serves 6 to 8.

# Share and share alike?

### Dear Aunt Bingo,

### Dear Loner.

Your letter focuses on two key issues. First, you think you are sharing more prize money with this buddy than she is with you, and second, you are feeling a bit crowded by this person and would perhaps like to go to Bingo without her.

I suspect that your real issue is the second one (which is why you signed your letter "The Loner" and why you were very careful to refer to her as a Bingo buddy rather than a friend), and you are using the money issue simply as an excuse for the real fact that you want to distance yourself from her.

My suggestion is that the next time she wins and tries to give you money, simply decline it, and tell her you think she should keep her winnings for herself and enjoy them. After she does, wait 20 minutes or so, then say, "Yes, I feel good that you kept your prize. It was your luck and you should enjoy it. Let's do this from now on!" Problem solved.

As far as distancing yourself from this buddy, the simplest solution is to go to Bingo on another day or go to a different hall—and don't tell her. If she calls and asks you to go to Bingo and you don't feel like it, simply say so. And if you are worried about hurting her feelings, agree to go with her on occasion, but less often then you currently do. # How to write a living will

### Dear Savvy Senior,

What's the best way to go about writing a living will? I'm approaching age 73 and in poor health and would like to get this done without spending a lot of money. — **Need Help** 

### Dear Need,

Preparing a living will now is a smart decision that gives you say in how you want to be treated at the end of your life. Here's what you should know, along with some resources to help you write one.

### What to Prepare

To adequately spell out your wishes regarding your end-of-life medical treatment you need two legal documents: A "living will" which tells your doctor what kind of care you want to receive if you become incapacitated, and a "health care power of attorney" (or health care proxy), which names a person you authorize to make medical decisions on your behalf if you become unable to.

These two documents are known as an "advance directive," and will only be utilized if you are too ill to make medical decisions yourself. You can also change or update it whenever you please.

It isn't necessary to hire a lawyer to prepare an advance directive. There are a number of free or low-cost do-ityourself resources available today to help you create one, and it takes only a few minutes from start to finish. Some top options include:

<u>CaringInfo.org:</u> This is a program created by the National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization that provides free state-specific living will forms that you can download, print and fill out. Or you can call 800-658-8898 and they will mail them to you and answer any questions you may

MyDirectives.com: If you'd rather create a digital (online only) advance directive, MyDirectives is an online tool and mobile app that will help you create, store and share a detailed, customized digital advance directive.

FiveWishes.org: This is another top-rated resource for creating a comprehensive paper or digital advance directive. They charge \$5 for the paper form and \$15 for the digital version, which is stored on the website that you or your family can access anytime.

VA Advance Directive: If you're a veteran, the VA also provides a free advance directive form specifically for you at VA.gov/find-forms/aboutform-10-0137.

### **Other Options**

If you're interested in making an entire estate plan that will include your will and/or trust, power of attorney and advance directive, there are many do-it-yourself online services that typically run between \$100 and \$250. Some top services include Quicken WillMaker & Trust software (WillMaker.com), Trust & Will (TrustandWill. com), and Legal Zoom (LegalZoom.

com), which also makes basic living wills for only \$39.

Or, if you'd rather have a professional do it for you, contact an estate planning attorney. See NAELA. org or NAEPC.org to help you locate someone in your area. Costs will vary depending on where you live, but you can expect to pay somewhere between \$500 and \$2,000 for a basic estate plan.

### Add-ons

You should also consider getting a do-not-resuscitate order (DNR) as part of your advance directive, since advanced directives do little to protect you from unwanted emergency care like CPR. To create a DNR, ask your doctor to fill out a state appropriate form and sign it.

Another tool you should know about that will complement your advance directive is the Physician Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment, or POLST (sometimes called Medical Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment, or MOLST). A POLST form translates your end-of-life wishes into medical orders to be honored by your doctors. To learn more about your state's program or set one up, see POLST.org.

### **Tell Your Family**

To ensure your final wishes are followed, make sure to tell your family members, health care proxy and doctors so they all know what you want. You should also provide them copies of your advance directive or if you create a digital version, make sure you share it electronically.



# The second largest poker **Bad Beat** jackpot was for \$1.7 million!

Imagine playing a hand of poker that you suffer such a brutal bad beat that you actually become the big winner! That's the beauty of a Bad Beat Jackpot as one player found out on September 27 at the Playground Poker Club in Quebec, Canada, to the tune of CAD \$2,275,388 (approximately \$1.7 million USD).

The hand took place at a \$2-\$5 no-limit hold'em cash game table when a player known only as "Elie" held the 9c9s - fun fact: that's the very same hand Phil Hellmuth had when he defeated Johnny Chan to win the 1989 World Series of Poker (WSOP) Main Event.

The board ran out Ac9hKc9dAs to give Elie four-of-a-kind nines, but it was no good as a player known as "Yann" held the AdAh for quad aces!

The Bad Beat Jackpot rules at the time stipulated that a qualifying hand needed to be quads against a better quads with each player using both their down cards. The card room's Bad Beat Jackpot rules state that the loser of the hand receives 40% of the pot, which came out to CAD \$864,000 (USD \$640,004) in this case. Yann earned 20% of the pot, or CAD \$455,077 (USD \$337,096).

The seven remaining players who were seated at the table during the \$2-\$5 game split 20% of the pot, each receiving CAD \$65,011 (USD \$48,156), and the players in other games around the room evenly split the remaining 20% of the bad beat jackpot.

The Bad Beat Jackpot was the second largest in history slightly behind a hand from August 9, 2023. That hand took place at a \$1-\$2 no-limit hold'em cash game and was for CAD \$2,590,185 (approximately \$1.9 million USD).

On a flop of 8d10d10h, Hoan Truong had flopped quads holding the 10c10s while his opponent, Marc Andre Ouellon, had the 6d9d for a straight flush draw. The 7d turn completed the straight flush, and some more chips went in the middle. After the 2d appeared on the river, Truong moved all in and Ouellon called with the winning hand.

Truong took home CAD \$984,270 for losing the bad beat, the largest share at the table, while Ouellon was paid half that amount (CAD \$492,135). The table share was CAD \$82,003.

Coincidentally, Playground Poker Club is also home to the previous largest bad beat jackpot and it was, oddly enough, a similar hand. In June 2022, quad 10's also lost to a straight flush for a \$2.2 million jackpot (\$1.64 million USD).

Later that summer, a \$1.2 million jackpot was set off at Rivers Casino in Pittsburgh when quad aces were cracked by the Royal Flush of Raymond Broderson, a local low-stakes poker player.

Not all poker rooms offer a Bad Beat Jackpot, so be sure to check wherever you play. You never known when you might take a beat only to score a huge payday.
