### October 28, 2018 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time Mark: 10:46-52

Dear St. Pius X and St. Anthony Church Family,

"I want to see!" (Mark 10:41) No, this is not the child pushing to the front of the line to watch a parade passing by, or a child climbing to get on his/her parent's shoulder to catch a better view of what is going on. It is a blind man who asks Jesus for healing and sight! The man was calling out to Jesus, even though the crowd was trying to shush him. Verse 48 says after he was told to be silent, 'he kept calling out all the more'! That is persistence, or using the word of the gospel, it is 'FAITH'! The blind man's hope and determination reminds me of another man who was creative in proving his persistence to 'See' Jesus, and that was Zacchaeus. Luke 19:3-4 says that Zacchaeus "was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd (and his short height).....So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus..." Witnessing such faith, and the lengths to which these men go to experience Jesus challenges me to ask how much effort I put into encountering Christ's grace? Would I be strong enough to keep 'calling out' even when the whole crowd tries to silence me? Would I be willing to appear crazy and go climb a tree to meet Jesus? When I feel I am not getting anything out of prayer, do I pout and whine about it? Do I give up and settle for an easier quick-fix or entertainment? OR, do I persistently approach Jesus in a new way, or through a new means? Both the blind Bartimaeus and the short Zacchaeus persist, and their lives are forever changed for the better. They both 'join Jesus' company'. No obstacle holds them back from Jesus. They just creatively come up with a 'work-around' and faithfully keep on pursuing Jesus. And they fruitfully encounter Him!

So if I am held back in one way, then I'll compensate for that difficulty. Try a new way, by taking up the challenge using another approach on a different level. Bartimaeus did! I love how verse 47 says, "On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out ...." 1) Hearing and 2) crying out! So, Bartimaeus is blind. That is one sense handicapped. But Bartimaeus is not deterred. He engages two different sense-abilities of 1)hearing and 2)speaking to break through. He can't see so he listens more closely. He can't see so he is quicker to speak up using his voice (maybe like a bat using sonar clicks to tell direction & detect obstacles). He doesn't just give up and hide in a hole. By opportunely placing himself near a high traffic road, he not only increases his chances to receive alms, but also makes more connections. By listening to passersby from all over the land, he may hear about exotic remedies or new cures to try out himself to heal his vision loss. I wouldn't call him a 'passive leach or moocher'. He shows great energy when a door to change opens, because the minute he heard Jesus called for him, verse 50 says he 'threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus'. He wants new life with Christ! And I suggest he brought a lot with him when he joined Christ. Those years sidelined in the crowd and on the road, would have given him great human experiences by encountering travelers from all over the country. I bet he brought so much practical and local wisdom to the missionary work of the apostles. They could use his helpful past experience and knowledge gleaned from travelers. He knew which back roads to take, what the 'word on the street' was, in each village. He knew how to negotiate through any trouble encountered along the highways. Bartimaeus goes from Verse 46 where he "sat by the roadside begging" to verse 52 where he 'followed Jesus on the way'. And I bet Zacchaeus, in his own different way, brought similarly useful and creative experience from his past, to his new saving work and ministry with Jesus. Being a 'chief tax collector' before he converted, I imagine that he, too, brought his contacts and ledger with him into Jesus' ministry. Zacchaeus goes from being a savvy grifter to a most generous giver. Luke 19:8 has him saying to Jesus, "Half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." He was keeping track, making amends four-fold to anyone he cheated. I suggest he brings his previous skill set and knowledge of how 'business works' to the ministry team of Jesus, but, all for the good now. Having converted, he sees straight through bad practice and manipulation. From the streets to the suites, or from the gutters to the rooftops both of these men's lives changed forever by encountering Jesus. Do we want to see?
