May 19, 2019 Fifth Sunday of Easter Jn 13:31-33a, 34-35

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

I love words! (I know that can be scary to hear a preacher say that! But notice I didn't say 'I love A LOT of words; I just said, 'words' in general!) Speaking of a 'few words', Pope Francis says this a lot (!). Most recently on Feb 7, 2018 in a papal audience Pope Francis offered advice to bishops, priests, and deacons that homilies need to be kept under ten minutes! He said, "Be brief and clear about the Lord speaking to His people". Way back in November 2013, Pope Francis wrote his first pastoral instruction 'Evangelii Gaudium' about preaching the Gospel of Joy. He made sure to emphasize that preaching should 'not be too long' and always include a "personalizing and enriching word for everyone" (EG #138). So today I like to point out that in only five verses (a short gospel reading!), we hear the word 'glory' used five times! I get the point! The Glory of the Father is the Son's witness and revelation of Him. Jesus is the Father's glory! Jesus is deflecting all talk about 'glory' away from Himself, and onto the Father. Glory belongs to God. For God, From God, About God, To God: Glory is All God's. Like the Great Amen at Mass that follows the Great Doxology, when we sing 'Through Him, With and in Him', we are declaring that Glory belongs to God out Creator alone! Any glory talk among Jesus' followers refers to the service of God and the fulfillment of God's command/God's will. In effect, Jesus is saying to us, "Am I glorified by your witness"? Do you glorify the Father, or not?" Our lives and practice of faith should reveal God to others. We may be too familiar with the song, "They will know we are Christians by our love", yet it strikes this same point. Christ is to be known in our work and witness, and we will be known as truly His disciples by our love given in service to other people.

An old friend used to have a favorite joke where he would ask someone, "Have you ever seen my pride and joy?" Of course, everyone figured he wanted to show a picture of his children or newest grandchild. So when you said no, then he opened his wallet and in one of the picture sleeves he had a commercial advertising of a bottle of **Pride** Furniture wax and **Joy** dishwashing detergent! Not at all what you expected! But often our pride and joy is some reflection of good work done by us, or some fruit born of love, like children and grandchildren. So Jesus says, my pride and joy is shown when my followers also do the Father's Will as I am. Another way of saying 'my pride and joy' would be 'my glory'. This 'glory' talk wonderfully introduces the 'New Command' of Jesus! In John 13:34-35, Jesus says, "I give you a new commandment: love one another....This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." It is as if Jesus is saying, "It is good for me, if you are good to one another. People will come to know me through you. How you live, how you serve, how you forgive, how you help, how you lead others to grow will all be witness/proof of me working in you.'

Yet, what screams out at me in this passage, is the word 'NEW'. What is new about it? Jesus had been teaching compassion and concern for others from the beginning. Nothing in the words of his teaching or command are new. So, what must be new now, is 'How' Jesus is going to be WITH them going forward in new form. His manner of being present among them is going to be new and different. Jesus mentions going to the Father. In John 13:3, He says, "I will be with you only a little while longer." But we know that He is always with us (Matthew 28:20). So it is His manner of presence that is about to change. In John 14:18, He told his disciples, "I will not leave you orphans". And in John 14:16 and 14:26, He introduces the Holy Spirit that will be sent in His Name to them. So, what is about to change is simply the form of His presence (Holy Spirit). The effect of this is that Jesus is inviting the disciples to put their own skin in the game. It is as if He tells them, "You have grown accustomed to knowing me, by my feeling my skin. As I go, and the Spirit comes to you, it is now going to take more of your skin to know me." His new command, is that they now have a share in His self-sacrificial work of saving love. 'Love one another as I have loved you.' Love took Jesus to the cross, so Love now invites us to follow Him there. The world will come to know Jesus in the Spirit through His faithful disciples who now have to come across with their own part in the following. The Spiritfilled disciples serving in His Name (the Church) reveal the presence of Jesus now!
