Filmmaker and show jumper Samia Staehle's goal was to capture the visceral way in which horses enrich our lives and heighten our senses. The film showcases the amazing kind of people that horses always seem to attract: individuals of enormous character, possessed of infinite work ethic, and often a very sharp sense of humor.

Set in Thermal, California the dry beauty of the desert and the horse show's hidden dusty trails are reminiscent of her one-time home in India, a land of adventure and freedom.

DESERT FLIGHT was shot with two-cameras over three-weeks by Tell Studios. Their crew from metropolitan Detroit with nearly zero experience with horses was set loose on the horse world, not without some trepidation from Staehle and her husband Daryl, the picture's Executive Producer. There was no script, only the mandate to go and find out what drives these horse people to do what they do every day. The result was DESERT FLIGHT.

ABOUT MEADVILLE PA

Founded in 1788 along the banks of French Creek in Northwestern Pennsylvania, Meadville is the County seat for Crawford County. Home to more than 13,000 full time residents and 2,000 Allegheny College students, Meadville is an active center for business, industry, education, the arts, recreation, service and tourism.

Meadville was settled on May 12, 1788, by a party of settlers led by David Mead. Its location was chosen well, for it lies at the confluence of Cussewago Creek and French Creek, and was only a day's travel by boat to the safety of Fort Franklin.

Their settlement was in a large meadow, first cleared by Native Americans led by Chief Custaloga, and well suited for growing maize. The village Custaloga built here was known as Cussewago.

Around 1800, many of the settlers to the Meadville area came after receiving land bounties for service in the Revolutionary War. Meadville became an important transportation center after construction of the French Creek Feeder Canal in 1837 and of the Beaver and Erie Canal it connected to at Conneaut Lake and subsequent railroad development.

Armed with a point and shoot camera, she was determined to capture the images that she wanted for her own walls. Upon returning home she joined Facebook and posted some of the images. She was shocked to have people message her to purchase her photos. It was the beginning of a new career in photography

Flash forward a few months and her 40th birthday was looming in the near future as well as the mortgage crisis that hit the United States which made her job all but unbearable. She took the impending birthday hard as it made her reevaluate my life. She was not happy in her job anymore, in fact she was miserable, so she decided to make some serious life choices before it was too late. She purchased her first DSLR as a birthday present to herself and then she quit her job. It was a scary and stressful time, taking a leap of faith without a safety net. Fortunately, it was a good move and she was able to open her own gallery featuring her artwork in downtown Meadville, PA.



Shortly after that she began a career as a freelance video journalist with the ABC and Fox affiliate stations in nearby Erie, PA and a photo journalist with the local Meadville Tribune.

The opportunity to work with video for the news station led her to another door and she was asked to record a local World War II Veteran's story for a living history project. This event led to her first Documentary Feature Film, and although she had no formal training in video or editing, the film has been well received and is now an award-winning documentary. Her experience catapulted her career in film and has opened more opportunities to tell the stories of more Veterans as well as local history and giving her a platform to bring public awareness to social issues such as animal cruelty. She is very proud to be a filmmaker and to give a voice to those stories waiting to be told.

Heather started working with Julianne Neal and EQUUS Film Festival in 2017 developing the "Hanging Barn" story for the SPOTLIGHT Rescue Series. This story was the reason for the MEADVILLE Tour Stop and will be featured on the EFF On-Line Platform as a continuing documentary series.

He learned to ride on the estate and then represented Trinidad on the National Show Jumping Team. From there he moved on to breeding farms at home, in the U.K. and in the U.S.

While in England, he earned an agricultural degree from Merristwood College before moving to Florida to work in the Thoroughbred racing industry.

He eventually moved on to the hunter/jumper show circuit as a rider and trainer and moved to Camden, South Carolina, in 1997 to manage Finally Farm.

Eventually Bruce decided to start his own business which led to the evolution of Nature's View equine programs.

He and partner Julianne Neal founded Nature’s View, Inc. and The Marley Project, a non-profit 501 (c)(3) dedicated to equine education and wellness. They work in Camden, and around the southeastern U.S., with counselors and mental health professionals, law enforcement agencies, school and church groups. Their first collaborative project, “THE EDGE: Bruce Anderson - Natural Humanship,” provides insight into Anderson's equine work.

Bruce also enjoys working with horse owners and their horses to assist them in building better relationships.
