9-12-21 - You are the Light of the World

Matthew 5:14-16 1 Peter 2:9

I have spent over 40 years constructing and maintaining transmission and distribution power. I hate to tell you but Penelec will probably let you down and you will be without power.

- 1) God will never let you down and his power is endless and eternal.
- 2) God gives us his power at our point of salvation when we decide to follow Jesus and make him Lord of our lives.

ACTS 1:8 **"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my** witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

2 TIMOTHY 1:7 "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and selfdiscipline."

Why do we need God's power in our lives?

3) Just as in electricity – power produces light!

MATTHEW 5:14-16 "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. ¹⁵ Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

If we would let the airfield lights burn out, I couldn't imagine what would happen to all of the aircrafts. We need all the lights to be working properly for efficient plane movement.

Pastor Keith has mentioned indulgences in our lives that distract or take us away from the light God wants us to be. I find myself being under the influence of things that distract me from being the light that God has called me to be. Sometimes something as simple as recreation can influence us away from God's best in our lives.

4) God's Word is a light that helps us!

PSALM 119:105 "Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path."

5) God has called us out of darkness into his light.

1 PETER 2:9 "But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light."

6) It pleases God to walk in his light.

1 JOHN 1:7 "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin."

My prayer is for each of us that our lights would shine. All of our lights together can shine so much more brightly.

God has called us here at SHUMC to be a light on the hill that cannot be hidden.

I pray that God can take a victory lap around us as our lights shine brightly for him!

<u>WE</u> know that we're all excited to be gathering again 'In person." And we are encouraging everyone to continue to come to church. However, the spread of the Delta variant is accelerating our need to be responsive, too.

As a leadership team, we are making decisions daily and will continue to do so over the next couple of weeks regarding COVID protocols here at SHUMC. 
