### Progress and Future Direction of CA Water Plan Topic of All Day Symposium

DWR and the Association of CA Water Agencies (ACWA) are co-hosting and <u>all day CA Water Plan briefing</u> discussing accomplishments of and future opportunities and next steps for creating a more resilient water system. Top-level administration officials will share the vision behind the CA Water Plan which is considered the State's roadmap toward sustainable water management, and discuss how it is intended to guide water policy in California. The symposium will also include breakout sessions to allow attendees to provide their input on issues such as statewide infrastructure investments, local water resources development, regional integrated management, water efficiency, environmental restoration, and disadvantaged communities. Registration is required.
