



Unfortunately the cruise was cancelled due to weather. Dan will reschedule and let everyone know the new date.





NSRA Safety Bulletin

It has been brought to our attention that issues have developed with the throttle cables that most everyone uses on their vehicles. It appears that the inner steel cable is rubbing a slot through the threaded portion of the throttle cable adjuster at the point where it, the cable, exits the threaded adjuster. In some instances, as the cable continues to cut deeper and deeper into the adjuster, the small strands of wires, making up the inner cable, are breaking. The cable then becomes "frayed" at that point. We have knowledge of at least two instances of these frayed cables becoming stuck and holding the throttle open; not letting it return to the idle position. One of the instances caused no problem, but the other ended in a catastrophic incident. It is our opinion that these cables need to be checked sooner than later as this could cause a very serious incident. Included are a couple of pictures to show how the cable is cutting into the adjuster. Thankfully neither one of these instances shown caused any incidents, or exhibit any of the small wires, making up the cable, being cut, but it should be obvious that the wires and therefore the cables could easily be compromised.

Obviously, the solution is to make sure the cable exits the housing parallel to the tube and not at an angle but this is easier said than done. All of these kits seem to mount differently and when you throw the transmission kick down into the mix and the fact that the throttle linkage moves in an arc rather than simply straight back and forth, it compounds the problem. I feel this could develop into a dangerous situation for some of the high mileage street rods that have been on the road for a while. We will start checking this when doing safety inspections.

It is best left to each individual as to how to eliminate the problem, because not any two suggestions will work in all instances. Please take time to look at your application; you could save yourself a serious incident. Remember, this situation could also be occurring at the pedal end of the cable, so it is best to check both ends of the throttle cable.
