My mother and I would have a moment each and every fall when we had a shared uncontrollable urge to decorate the house for the season. I would begin by slowly driving by likely places that would have bittersweet growing by the roadside. My mother was always the first one to spot the first patch, and let out a yelp for me to stop. Luckily, no one rear-ended the car because once I heard her voice, my foot was on the brakes and gravel went in all directions.

Mom would jump out of the car, clippers firmly clutched in her hand, and leap over the ditch to get hold of the bittersweet before anyone else spotted it.

It seemed so wrong, to us, that some farmers sprayed along their fences, depriving us of our goal. Perhaps, it was the road crews who mowed the ditches.

Finally, one year, my mother tripped and fell into some weeds. She claimed that she was fine, but mother never did admit to pain. The next day, however, she asked my father to look at a rash that she had on her arm. The rash kept getting worse and, finally, she decided that just maybe she would see a doctor – but maybe tomorrow. Finally, she saw a doctor who pronounced the verdict – poison ivy with a touch of poison oak. It took weeks and weeks and lots of cream to make the rash go down. My mother was miserable the whole time, which is saying a lot for someone who never let anything get her down. The next year fall came around and both of us wanted to decorate for the season, only this time we decided that artificial bittersweet looked just fine, along with a few candles.

AHS Amana Family Tree Project Receives Award of Excellence

The Amana Heritage Society, specifically the volunteers working on the Amana Family Tree, were recognized for their work with an Award of Excellence from the Iowa Museum Association.

The award, one of only two such awards in Iowa this year, was announced last week at the annual autumn conference of museum staff and directors in Des Moines.

The award noted the efforts of dedicated volunteers Lothar Beyer, RC Eichacker and Cathy Berggren for their diligence, hard work and many contributions to the long term Amana Family Tree project. These volunteers and others were cited for their work as major contributors to the Amana Family Tree. Included in the award nomination was recognition of the ongoing team work between the Amana Heritage Society staff and volunteers and those of the Ronneburg area in Germany in finding and recording links and connections in the creation of this comprehensive family tree.

What's wonderful is that the Amana Family Tree online (see the amanaheritage.org) allows anyone with a name or some detail to begin a search online, for free, for accurate information about people born into or linked to the Amana community in Germany and here in America.
