#### **COME TO THE WATER...!**

Exodus 17:3-7; Ps. 95:1-2, 6-9; Rom. 5:1-2, 5-8; John 4:5-42

The Church continues to grow in our time! Two weeks ago, five of our catechumens, Jack Daniel, Kavia Garayua, Nyia Garayua, Raymond Molina and Jarilyn Rodriguez, were among the many who were "elected" by the Archbishop, Cardinal Dolan, at St. Patrick's Cathedral in preparation for the Sacrament of Initiation this Easter. These catechumens have come to us thirsty for "Living Water," Jesus Christ. For the past two years, they have been on a journey of faith together with their directors and sponsors. They have been searching for Christ, and today we are going to celebrate the "First Scrutiny" in readying them for the reception of the sacraments at Easter Vigil.

Although we are in liturgical Year C, the celebration of our catechumens requires that we use the readings from Year A lectionary. Today's first reading is deliberately chosen to fit the gospel reading, in which Jesus promises the Samaritan woman that He will give her the water of life. It is an obvious fact that in the dry climate of Palestine, water is a symbol of salvation. Therefore, in the first reading, it is not unusual that the Israelites complained when they were faced with thirst aggravated by the scourging desert sun and heat. They confronted Moses: "Why did you ever make us leave Egypt?" They wanted to go back to Egypt where they could die honorably as slaves rather than die shamefully as animals in the desert under the pretext of freedom. Water is vital to one's survival especially when going on a long journey.

Our catechumens have surely begun their "journey of faith." Jack, Kavia, Nyia, Raymond and Jarilyn are definitely thirsty for this *Living Water*. They have discovered that "No one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit" (John 3:5). Thus, like the Samaritan woman, they are asking, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty..." (John 4:15). Together with the catechumens, you and I are on a journey of faith! In this journey, like the Israelites, we are often faced with hardship in various forms. We are often tempted. There are different demands made of us in our families, in our work places, in our community and in the church. We are faced with the material and financial obligations to support our families, church and community.

Often, life can be tough and stressful. We sometimes feel the scourging heat of being faithful to our commitments - the demands of sacrificing our time and our treasure for the good of those in need. We may be challenged by the absence of love, unity and peace in the family - diagnosis of serious ailment - the loss of a loved one. It is sometimes very difficult to remain faithful upon recovery from substance abuse. When you or I are faced with such difficulties, we are tempted to "go back to Egypt" - to go back to our old ways. As a result, we fail to appreciate all the good deeds and the good things God has done for us. In any situation, we should count our blessings and give thanks to God for His goodness to us. Now is the time to stop whining and complaining about the difficulties we face in our Christian journey. We must believe and trust in God's benevolent love. If we trust in Christ, even when we go through a rough patch, He will be there to provide for our basic needs. He will strengthen us and lead us to His everlasting glory. Christ assures us that: "Whoever drinks the water (He) shall give will never thirst". And, "Come to Me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest" (Matt. 11:18). Therefore, "If today you hear His voice, harden not your
