



John 8:12-20 (p. 870)

¹²Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, 'I am the light of the R world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life.' 13Then the Pharisees said to him, 'You are testifying on your own behalf; your testimony is not valid.' ¹⁴Jesus answered, 'Even if I testify on my own behalf, my testimony is valid because I know where I have come from and where I am going, but you do not know where I come from or where I am going. ¹⁵You judge by human standards; I judge no one. ¹⁶Yet even if I do judge, my judgement is valid; for it is not I alone who judge, but I and the Father who sent me. ¹⁷In your law it is written that the testimony of two witnesses is valid. 18 testify on my own behalf, and the Father who sent me testifies on my behalf.' 19 Then they said to him, 'Where is your Father?' Jesus answered, 'You know neither me nor my Father. 




