Live Performance & Recording Instructions:

- 1. Please have the student dressed in performance attire.
- 2. The student will bow before and after the sonata performance both in person and on the recording if choosing to do the virtual option.
- 3. After the first bow, the student will say his/her name and the sonata/movement/composer to be performed.
- 4. For virtual entries, please have the student positioned in the video where the student can be viewed from head to toe on the recording. This will help the judge be able to view the student's posture, hand positions, fingering, and pedaling, where applicable.
- 5. Memorization is required for piano students. Memorization is not required for collaborative pieces with two or more instruments.
- We are trying our best to simulate a performance experience for the virtual entries, but we understand that with the recording option, many recording takes can be made. We hope that students will take this opportunity to submit their best work. Although it will not be a live performance, this experience will enhance their experience with the recording process.
