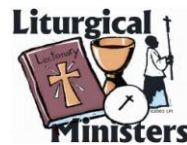

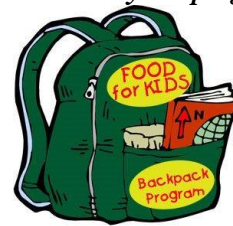

FROM THE PASTOR

September 30, 2018
Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48 and James 5:1-6

Dear St. Pius X and St. Anthony Church Family,

A soccer coach tells a player: "That was a great score and kick you made, it was just in the wrong goal net!" I thought of that recently when I was watching my nephew's soccer team play a game. *They are a great team and he is a good forward player. But I am not.* I chaperoned a youth trip once and in our free time, some of the kids started up a little game and inviting me in. It was only about five minutes into it, before one of the guys got up the nerve to ask, "You have never played soccer before, have you?" I thought, "What gave it away, that I have never had possession of the ball or that I've kicked everybody's shins several times over?" ***I must confess, I do not know a thing about soccer! But I tried!*** They did ask me to join, but I should have told them I had never played the sport before! When I was growing up, baseball and bike racing were my sports. But the apostles in the gospel today reveal that they do not know *how to tell teams apart or play in the game of spreading the gospel* kingdom of Jesus. They meet an evangelist who casts out demons in Jesus' name, and ***they STOP the man from doing his good work.*** Can you believe it? Why would they try to stop a fellow evangelist from preaching Jesus' Way, and performing good work in His Name? JEALOUSY! The apostles' tell on themselves when they answer. John speaks for them saying, "***We*** tried to prevent him because he does not ***follow us.***" (Mark 9:38) The apostles 'hi-jacked' Jesus' work, suddenly calling it their own! They didn't say 'because he doesn't follow you Jesus'. No, they said the man didn't follow THEM. He didn't do things THEIR WAY. So jealously they tried to shut the other evangelist down! But Jesus wonderfully says, 'Get over yourselves, you serve in the Name of Jesus, not your own. If someone does good in my Name, let it be. If they are not obviously opposed to us, then assume they are with us on the same team.' To further expose why the apostles are so jealous, remember that on at least one occasion (possibly many others), the apostles are ***humbled by their inability to cast out a demon*** from a boy successfully. As mentioned last week, in Mark 9, a man brings his son straight to Jesus, after the apostles had tried to heal the demon from him and failed. Verse 18 has the man tell Jesus, "I asked your disciples to drive it out, but they were unable to do so." Embarrassed, the apostles later ask Jesus privately, "Why could we not drive it out?" (Mark 9:28). Jesus suggests it is due to their little faith, their misunderstanding of Him and their lack of deep prayer (Mark 9:29). It seems their weak egos and envy lead them to deny others opportunities to serve Jesus!

So, did the apostles learn the lesson from last week about who is the greatest in the kingdom of God? ***Apparently not,*** as this week they went right back to ***declaring themselves boss,*** and judging who is an 'authorized' servant of Jesus and who is not? They arrogantly deny a fellow minister his place serving Jesus. I think the apostles are blacklisting the 'unknown exorcist' because he doesn't have an apostles' union card. ***But the apostles are forgetting who they are serving.*** Not themselves, but Jesus. I heard a preacher say once about humility in ministry, 'I have to remember that I am not the carpenter. I am only the instrument in the carpenter's hand!' Absolutely! Any good I do, is by the movement and grace of God, so to God goes the credit and glory. I say to myself, "You know what I can do?" ***Nothing*** alone. Apart from God, nothing I do bears fruit! Jesus Himself says that to all of us, "without me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). And St Paul repeats the message when he writes in Galatians 6:3, "For if anyone thinks he is something when he is nothing, he is deluding himself." True power, reveals itself to the degree it is shared & given away. In Luke 7:35, Jesus says, "Wisdom is vindicated by her children!"
