## For Immediate Release:

On November 29, at 8:18am, Sergeant Daniel Kellogg was dispatched to a residence on Cedar Hill Avenue for a reported stolen motor vehicle. It appears that unknown person(s) removed the vehicle sometime during the overnight hours. Matter has been referred to the Wyckoff Police Department Detective Bureau.

On December 2, at 8:00am, Officer Michael Scalise was dispatched to a residence on Midland Avenue to take a report of a stolen bicycle. It appears that unknown person(s) had entered a detached garage where the door was left open. A TREK Mountain Bicycle was removed. Matter has been referred to the Wyckoff Police Department Detective Bureau.
