FROM THE PASTOR

May 26, 2019
Sixth Sunday of Easter
Jn 14:23-29

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

We are all students! Don't we all wake up every day in the 'Universe-city'? With all of the graduations happening around us at this time of year, I am reminded that graduations do not bring an end to learning. We are just starting. Because who knows everything? I know I don't. Isn't the first sign of wisdom, to acknowledge that we do not know it all? In verse 26 of today's gospel, Jesus says, "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit that the Father will send in my name—he will **teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you** (Jn 14:26) I love this line, because it tells me three things. First, 1) Whatever Jesus has not done personally, He will see to it that the Holy Spirit does personally for us. Secondly, that 2) The Holy Spirit is The Teacher, as 1 Corinthians 2:11 says, "No one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God." We all have questions. When will they all get answered? Well, keep asking! St Anselm (Great Church Teacher living around 1100 AD) identified the motivation behind religion as '**faith seeking understanding**'. To me, 'seeking' means asking questions! St Paul in Romans 10:14 points out, "How can they believe in Christ of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone to preach?" If we substitute the word 'profess' for 'preach', then our faith leaders are better called '**professors**'. The job of professors is to answer questions, or at least open the way toward finding answers. A good teacher shows students how to go about finding the answers to questions, or solutions to problems. I know as a pastor I am asked a lot of questions about our faith and the Church. I love being asked them because often I do not know the answers. But, the questions lead me to pursue & seek the answers with the questioner. Every question is a new project! **Thank you for any questions!** How many times do we hear people say, "I can't wait to get to heaven so I can ask God about...."? Well, try these out: "Did Adam have a belly button?" or "Were there mosquitoes in Paradise?" Here is a new one that just came up in the news, after a science headline in April: "Was the recently reported first picture ever of a black hole (one in Galaxy M87) that showed a *spinning red glow* around a dark center—could that have been a shot of what Genesis 3:24 described as the "stationed cherubim and the *fiery revolving sword* east of the garden of Eden, to guard the way to the tree of life"? We have to wait for a 'final answer', but such questions keep us learning and keep us asking. If you are like me, and think you can't remember them 'til later, then write them down. I keep a running list of questions to tackle next!

Wait! "What was the third thing from today's gospel, Father?" Oh, yeah, the third thing this line (Jn 14:26) from Jesus tells me, is that Jesus knows we didn't catch it all from Him the first time. With Jesus and the Holy Spirit we have **patient teachers**. Thank God, Jesus waits for us to catch up. He gently guides our lessons, leading us along to ask the next question at the right time, to be led into the deeper truth of reality. How many of us at times say, "Oh, there was something else I was going to ask, but I can't remember it right now" Well, Jesus will stay with us until the question comes back to us. Jesus knows, and He knows us. Thinking such 'God thoughts' is more than our minds can hold. St Paul says, in 1 Corinthians 2:9 that "no eye has seen nor ear heard, not even entered the human heart what God has ready for those who love him." Our minds can't hold it all. But that is where our faith and our questions come in, to keep us going. And God will answer them. Jesus says in John 16:12-13 "I have much more to tell you, but **you cannot bear it now**. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, **he will guide you into all truth**." The Spirit will lead us into all truth. Maybe today? Okay, maybe not, then maybe for another day. One day it will all be made clear. Luke 8:17 says, "Nothing is hidden that will not become visible, and nothing secret that will not be known and come to light." So we stay with Jesus, follow his lessons, do our work and keep on learning as faithful disciples.
