Day 1 - NJ/Quebec City, Canada

Today we depart early from New Jersey, to Quebec City in Canada. We will stop en-route for a picnic lunch (included). Our arrival will be sometime in mid/late afternoon. Upon arrival we will check-in to our hotel and have some time to freshen up before taking a gentle walk to the old town. Overnight in Quebec.



Day 2 - Quebec City - Walking Tour

This morning after a refreshing night's rest and a hearty breakfast, we begin a walking tour of the old city. We will see such places as the Old Quebec quarter, the fortifications, Place Royale, the Parliament Building and the many monuments of this Old World city. Overnight in Quebec City.



Day 3 - Sainte Anne de Beaupre

Today, after breakfast, we will leave for the Shrine of St. Ann in Beaupre, where we will spend almost the entire day. We will begin by driving along Canada's oldest road, through historical villages on the north bank of the St. Lawrence River. Upon arrival, there will be a guided tour of the Basilica and Shrine. Inside you will see the chapels within the Basilica, the Pieta` (an exact replica of the original Michelangelo in Rome) and the Scala Santa which houses the replica of the Holy Stairs which Jesus ascended . The balance of the day will be free to enjoy the

day. There will be free time to explore further or to visit the Sainte Anne Museum and the Basilica gift shop. This evening you will enjoy a dinner cruise with wine included aboard a lovely cruiser, such as the MV Louis Jolliet for an unforgettable evening with a three-course meal at sunset. Overnight in Quebec.



Day 4 - Montreal City

After breakfast we will have an early departure for the beautiful Old and Modern city of Montreal. Upon arrival in Montreal we will check in at our hotel and have some time to relax and renew. A walking tour of the Old Town and free time to stroll on your own is planned for this afternoon. Tonight we can meander through Vieux Ville (Old Town) where you may have a delicious dinner (on your own) in one of the hundreds of French/Canadian style restaurants of the old village. For those who are still

willing, we will spend some free time in the Old Town wandering through the many boutiques, shops or just enjoying the sidewalk performers and shows which continue into the late hours of the evening. Overnight in Montreal.

Day 5 - Montreal City Tour

Today after breakfast we will begin the deluxe city tour of Montreal. A complete tour of this lovely city taking in over 200 points of interest, including a guided tour of Notre Dame Basilica, outside view of the Olympic Stadium, McGill University and a panoramic view from the top of Mount Royal. the world. We will also visit the famous Saint Joseph Oratory set high upon the hill of Mount Royal. Tonight you may wish dine (on your own) in Continental style at the renowned French restaurant "Le Parchemin", once the old parsonage of Montreal's Anglican Cathedral above the world largest underground mall*. (*Le Parchemin require proper dress and reservations*.) Overnight in Montreal.

*With over 32 km (20 mi) of tunnels spread over more than 12 km² (4.6 sq mi), connected areas include <u>shopping malls</u>, apartment buildings, <u>hotels</u>, condominiums, <u>banks</u>, offices, <u>museums</u>, <u>universities</u>, seven <u>metro</u> stations, two commuter train stations, a regional <u>bus terminal</u> and the <u>Bell Centre</u> amphitheatre and arena. [2] There are more than 120 exterior access points to the underground city. Each access point is an entry point to one of 60 residential or commercial complexes comprising 3.6 km² (1.4 sq mi) of floor space, including 80% of all office space and 35% of all commercial space in downtown Montreal. <u>Day 6 -- Laurentian Mountains</u> Tour/ Mont Tremblant

Day 7 - Montreal Free Day

Today will be an entirely free day to enjoy the city on your own. Montreal is very safe and an easy city to move around independently. The public transportation is very good



and the taxis are very reliable. Today might be a nice day to shop in rue Sainte Catherine, lined with shops, boutiques and department stores for several miles. Very close to our hotel; you may want to visit the largest underground mall in the world with it hundreds

Take a walk up to Bishop Street and enjoy one of the many bistros and restaurants for lunch. You can stroll on Sainte Denis in the Latin Quarter lined from top to bottom with restaurants, cafes and patisserie. Happy Hour on St. Denis is great with many places offering the best oysters and mussels from the cold north Atlantic waters of Prince Edward Island. "If you enjoy vodka, have an oyster shooter!" Alternatively, it might be nice to return to Old Town amidst its charm and ambience. Those who feel lucky may want to go to the Casino de Montreal and try their hand at the machines or game tables. Tonight we will regroup in our hotel lobby to be transferred to fine French/Canadian restaurant for our Farewell Dinner (included) and overnight in Montreal.

Day 8 - Montreal/New Jersey

After breakfast, this morning, we bid a fond "Au Revoir" to our neighbors in the north, as we head homeward bound with lovely thoughts and memories of this Canadian Adventure. En route we will stop in beautiful Lake George, New York for lunch (on your own) and some free time to take in the beauty of this magnificent village and lake. Overnight at home!

<u>Reservations/Deposits/Payments</u>: A deposit of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) is required at the time of booking. No reservation is confirmed until the deposit is received by the tour operator. The balance of the tour price is due and payable sixty (60) days prior to departure.

Minors And Infirm: Children under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent/guardian or a responsible adult deemed worthy by the parent/guardian. If a minor is traveling with any person other than parent/guardian then the responsible adult will provide the travel agent/tour operator and have in his/her possession a notarized letter from the parent/guardian giving that adult full permission to make decisions on their behalf and permission to room with the minor. No minor will be allowed to room alone without the parent/guardian or named responsible adult. Due to the physical demands of the tour and the inaccessibility of handicap facilities abroad, physically handicapped persons must contact the Tour Operator prior to registration

Tour Price: The tour price in this brochure is based upon the U. S. currency vs. the Canadian Dollar at the time of printing, November 5, 2013. If changes in these rates occur, it may change the price accordingly. The tour price is based on booking a minimum of 30 paying passengers. A lesser amount could increase the price of the tour.
