 - They first thing she mentioned was that burglaries are crimes of opportunities. She recommended that everyone get an automatic garage door closer (it can be set from 90 seconds to 3 minutes) as it ensures your garage doors will not be accidentally left open. City Park is one of those selected for three weekend rest days a month. In actuality because of grandfathered events, three rest days per month are not possible. It will vary from zero to three days with one being the most common. However if or when those events decide to move or to discontinue, those days will not be filled with an event.
