Delta Forensics Training Programs

Latent Print Processing

24 Hours (\$399/person)

Scope:

This class is designed to instruct forensic science practitioners and students in the areas of processing physical evidence for the development of latent impressions on various substrates.

Class:

This class is designed to introduce students to this type of evidence and the various types of evidentiary items that impression evidence may be found upon, and the various development reagents that may be used to further enhance the contrast of the impressions. Through an introduction of the various types of surfaces (non-porous, porous, semi-porous, adhesive surfaces, and blood impressions) a variety of techniques will be discussed for the development of impressions. Students will further develop their understanding through the use of hands-on exercises, working through each of the surfaces in a sequential method. The methods demonstrated in class may include reagents that can be used within the laboratory setting as well as in the field to increase the yield of probative evidence during the investigative process.

Students will also learn various methods of lifting and preservation of evidence through the use of tapes, hinge lifts, gel lifts and casting methods. All materials are supplied by the instructor.
