Advent and Christmas at First Baptist

As we enter this special time of the year in a time of pandemic, we are continuing traditional celebrations, with some adjustments, and finding some new and alternative ways to celebrate the Advent and Christmas seasons.



Poinsettias

For many, purchasing a poinsettia for the sanctuary is an

opportunity to remember or honor a loved one. We will make that opportunity available again this year. For \$10, you may provide a poinsettia. Email or call the church office for details, or simply send a check for \$10 or use the PayPal button from our website and indicate if the poinsettia is in honor of or in memory of a loved one.

Here is the wrinkle for this year: since we are worshiping on Zoom, we will scale back on decorating our sanctuary this year, and we will order a limited number of poinsettias. We will purchase those poinsettias with budgeted funds and all donations given toward poinsettias will go to support Food at First, helping feed people in need in our community. So our tradition will continue, although altered a bit – the sanctuary will be beautiful, loved ones will be remembered, and we will help meet human need in our community.



Advent at Home Kits

We encourage you to sign up for an Advent at Home Kit filled with devotions, activities, a carol booklet, and more. (You even get a recipe for the ham balls we serve at the Church Christmas Dinner!) Email the church or note in the Zoom chat on Sunday if you would like a kit. You may drive through the parking lot on November 29 between 1:30-2 pm to pick up your kit. When you drive through, you may take home a hymnal if you wish for your own use (blue hymnal, black hymnal or both.)

If you prefer, we can deliver the kit to you. And if you are out of town, we can send you an electronic copy of *An Illustrated Advent*, which is a big part of our kits.





Hanging of the Greens: We will be decorating the church as we typically do but focus on the front on the sanctuary. A very few people will be hanging greenery and decorating the sanctuary on Sunday, November 29 at 2 pm. This will be a Zoom event – we will be able to see the sanctuary being decorated and visit with friends as it happens. (You provide your own hot chocolate.)

Yuletide Orchestra: We are putting together a Virtual Yuletide Orchestra video. If you play an instrument and would like to participate, please contact Pastor Dave or Mindy. We are hoping to make videos of two Christmas carols that will be used in worship. All ages welcome!

Christmas Program: We will not be able to have our annual Christmas Dinner this year, but our youth are working on a Virtual Christmas Program. It will be presented following worship on Sunday, December 20.

Christmas Eve: We will have our Christmas Eve service at 6 pm, with a Social Hour preceding it, beginning at 5 – as we typically do. This year, however, it will be on Zoom. There will be some live portions, along with a lot of wonderful music that will be recorded in advance. We will end the service with lighting our individual candles as we sing Silent Night. (You will find candles in your Advent at Home kits!)

Mid-Iowa Community Action, Inc. (MICA) offers a food pantry to families in Story County. Because of the pandemic our church did not have our usual collection for MICA this fall, but we encourage you to drive through the parking lot on November 29 between 1:30-2 pm and drop off items for MICA.

Most Needed Items!

Toilet Paper, Kleenex, Paper Towels, Peanut butter, Tuna, Canned Beans – this provides protein for some families

Other items needed:

Non-perishable, unopened, and unexpired food items - Bring things that YOU would enjoy eating. Rice, flour, sugar, Jello, hot cocoa packets, juice, pasta, pancake mixes, syrup, canned tomatoes and paste, coffee, tea and canned chicken.

Personal hygiene items – bath soap, shampoo, women's supplies, shaving crème and deodorant

Household supplies – dish soap, cleaning products, hand sanitizer

Infant needs – diapers of all sizes and wipes, baby food

Money – Mica gives food vouchers to be used for milk, eggs, meat and fresh vegetables and fruit.

The Christmas Offering is an opportunity to help provide for those most in need in our community. Half of the offering goes to The Bridge Home (formerly the Emergency Residence Project), our homeless shelter in Ames. The other half goes to our Benevolence Fund, which is distributed to those coming to our church seeking assistance. In this time when many are out of work and unable to pay rent, the need is great. The Christmas Offering will be highlighted on December 13 and will be received throughout the month of December.

Local Mission Support

Through budgeted funds and special offerings as well as our hands-on efforts, our church supports many caring ministries in our community. We have \$2000 in our budget set aside for assisting groups in our community who may especially need support. This year the deacons voted to give \$1000 each to Food at First and the Story County COVID-19 Emergency Fund for Immigrants.

Food at First, located at First Christian Church, provides a free meal to anyone in the community, every day, as well as a free grocery distribution. Meals have been packaged and picked up outside since March. There have been increased costs due to packaging of meals, and over these past months there has been a sizable increase in the number of people coming for a meal.

The Story County COVID-19 Emergency Fund for Immigrants provides assistance to immigrants in our community who have especially been hard hit by loss of jobs because of the pandemic. Many, even those who are taxpayers, are not eligible for governmental assistance programs. A number of churches and social agencies including the United Way joined together to establish this fund that has served over 100 households and made over 400 rent and utility payments to date.
