

## “Solomon – the Seduction of Prosperity”

1 Kings 11:1–11

Why did Solomon not finish well as King of Israel?

### I. Too much of a good thing can seduce unto \_\_\_\_\_

#### A. Solomon made alliances through many marriages. – 1 Kings 11:1–11

<sup>1</sup> Now King Solomon loved many foreign women along with the daughter of Pharaoh: Moabite, Ammonite, Edomite, Sidonian, and Hittite women, <sup>2</sup> from the nations concerning which the Lord had said to the sons of Israel, “You shall not associate with them, nor shall they associate with you, for they will surely turn your heart away after their gods.” Solomon held fast to these in love.

1. God warned Israel not to make strong associations with the surrounding nations. -- **Exodus 34:12–15**

#### B. Solomon had too many wives to devote himself to \_\_\_\_\_.

**V3-4** “He had seven hundred wives, princesses, and three hundred concubines, and his wives turned his heart away. <sup>4</sup> For when Solomon was old, his wives turned his heart away after other gods; and his heart was not wholly devoted to the Lord his God, as the heart of David his father had been.”  
See v5-6

1. **Lesson:** “Seeking too much of a good thing can keep us from devoting ourselves to serving the Lord Jesus in this life.

#### C. Solomon loved his foreign wives more than the \_\_\_\_\_.

**v8** Thus also he did for all his foreign wives, who burned incense and sacrificed to their gods.

1. The Lord Jesus was clear about who is worthy of Him - **Matthew 10:37–38** \_\_\_\_\_

### II. Prosperity can turn one away from the \_\_\_\_\_ of the Lord.

**A. Prosperity is not wrong.** -Psalm 112:2–3 — “... The generation of the upright will be blessed. <sup>3</sup> Wealth and riches are in his house, And his righteousness endures forever.”

**B. But prosperity can become our \_\_\_\_\_ and comes with subtle traps. How?**

1. Becoming obsessed - **Psalm 52:7** \_\_\_\_\_
2. Prosperity can give a false sense of security – **Proverbs 11:4**

**C. Application: We live in a nation where we are comparatively prosperous.**

1. Materialism can keep us from \_\_\_\_\_ the word of the Lord.
2. Materialism can distract us from \_\_\_\_\_ our God.
3. **In the last days** the pursuit of pleasure and materialism will doom them. -- **Luke 17:28–29**

### III. The greater the light God gives us the greater the \_\_\_\_\_ for disobedience –

**A. God gave Solomon much light - He had appeared to him twice.**

<sup>9</sup> Now the Lord was angry with Solomon because his heart was turned away from the Lord, the God of Israel, who had appeared to him twice, <sup>10</sup> and had commanded him concerning this thing, that he should not go after other gods; but he did not observe what the Lord had commanded. <sup>11</sup> So the Lord said to Solomon, “Because you have done this, and you have not kept My covenant and My statutes, which I have commanded you, I will surely tear the kingdom from you, and will give it to your servant.”

1. Is the command of the Lord more important than prosperity?
2. Right now, how are you using your prosperity for God’s kingdom?
3. Rededicate your love for Christ, over all else that you hold dear.
