OTIS PROJECT

Many of you attended the April luncheon and heard about a COPD awareness project at Otis College of Art and Design. One class of 15 talented students spent semester developing this project to help spread the word about COPD. In very recent years COPD has increased to become the third leading cause of death in the U.S. Most people don't realize that COPD kills 50% more women each year than breast cancer. Yet COPD gets very little recognition or research. So awareness is very important.

On April 26 Teri Neilson and I attended the Otis final class presentation at BreatheLA in Los Angeles. downtown BreatheLA.org was the primary sponsor of this project and they referred the Otis students to PEP because of our participation in their COPD forums. BREATHE LA is a non-profit public benefit organization dedicated to the future of clean air and healthy lungs in Los Angeles County. Teri and I have become involved in these projects as part of our PEP Pioneers outreach efforts.

The Otis class was divided into 4 teams who assumed various

ballshapes and images to represent the lungs and form the basis for a logo. Next they came up with themes and graphics for maximum exposure including signs and billboard, aspects of the awareness campaign. The first team employed



The second team took the logo themes and designed stick-on patches that can be worn on clothing and breathing equipment to describe COPD. Many of us get funny looks and questions as we venture out with our portable oxygen systems. The students thought these patches would allow us to customize our equipment and educate the public at the same time. Teri has a limited supply of these patches and we have discussed ordering more if there is a demand.

The third team devised a 'flash mob' campaign complete with T-shirts and tested it at the Otis cafeteria. The fourth team



designed a Breathing Room comprised of air-filled plastic bags to represent alveoli which can be used at health fairs and conferences.

All in all it was an exciting project and both Teri and I were honored to assist. Our involvement with BreathLA has allowed Pioneers to have a larger impact on the local community, to help educate others to get tested for COPD and to stress importance of pulmonary rehab.
