Colonial Acres Phase V Minutes October 11, 2023

1:05 pm meeting commenced Phones silenced, Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

All board members present: Gloria P., Mike G., Judy S., Judy K., Katy K. Form Clearview Stacy was present on a Zoom call and Paul Zaytek present.

Gloria spoke of Jim's passing and how sad that is but assured us that Clearview would continue with their service to our community. We now have Paul Zaytek joining us. He's been with Clearview for many years and knows our property well. He is well aware of all the projects going on past, present, and future. We did meet with Stacy and Paul not long after we learned of Jim's passing and were reassured that things would not change. We do have one more year in our contract with Clearview property management.

Stacy on Zoom giving a management report. Two buildings remain to be power- washed, the painting is finishing and being held up at times by the weather. Concrete is done except the handicap ramps. You're looking for a new vendor to do the handicapped ramps. The leak in the kitchen from the exhaust fan is being looked at as it needs a different cap on the roof, and it is being worked on. The sprinklers are almost all flushed and turned off for the season.

Financial reports published in the newsletter. Our reserves are on target. Audits will be done by an independent company. The board approved the minutes from August and September and approves the financial report.

Old Business

- 1. Park bench for Ticonderoga and Heritage will be brought to this address from up north. Suggested placement was Northwest side of the corner underneath the trees? It was promised to be done before the "snow flies".
- 2. The new member orientation went well questions, were asked and answered. The new people who attended said they like the orientation and gained knowledge. The question was asked whether orientation should be increased to two times per year? Suggestion was to see how the sales went and when we had enough, we'd have an orientation probably April and September.
- 3. Water usage. Stacy has called the city and a work order has been put in to check all of our water meters. There are differences between buildings, and we are going to watch those buildings closely and have the members check their homes for leaks, running toilets, dripping faucets, etc. Just a reminder, we all pay for the water, it comes out of our monthly HOA. A member did point out there is such a thing as drought-free grass

which of course would help with water usage. To be discussed with Jamie.

There is a service provided by DTE where they come to your home and check your pipes and any way to save energy. You can call them and set up an appointment. The request for an agenda prior to the meeting to be sent out? Post it in the prior newsletter prior to the meeting. That is very difficult to do since our meetings are the second Wednesday of the month sometimes that's early and sometimes that's late, but the newsletter people need the information going into the newsletter by the 15th of the month. So, you would just have one board meeting and within a week or less sometimes you would have to have an agenda for the next meeting. Agendas are very difficult to put together you have to see what gets done during the month and what pops up.

4. SNOW. That dreadful stuff. It's coming folks. You will have to move your car, get to know your neighbors as a lot of times your particular street may have a strategy. New people ask your neighbors. Many complaints about the curbs being destroyed by the snowplows, we need to discuss with Lewis Brothers it there is a way to prevent that from happening. It adds a big cost to our cement replacement every year. Don't park your car over the sidewalk it makes it difficult for the shovelers to get the sidewalk cleared. Please review the rules and regulations about how to move your car during the snow season.

New Business

- 1. Signage. Is it possible to take a survey of how many people actually cut through here? We need bigger signs closer to the road, a copy of a sign was presented to the board, we will look into it. Mike G. has a company that makes signs that are affordable.
- 2. Slippery Bridges. We have two on our property. They are very slippery when wet and especially covered in wet leaves. Paul Z. has looked at them and there a few fixes. We could apply grip-strips, we could paint after being power washed with gripper paint. There is some type of metal strips that can be applied. Looking into that.
- 3. Should we move the sign by the clubhouse pond "members only, members must be with guest"? Presently it is hidden by the LED sign.
- 4. 2024 Budget. The board will be meeting with Clearview this month to approve a budget for the next year.

Member Concerns

A complaint about over decorating outside our units. You can decorate inside your courtyard that is your property. Please be aware that outside your courtyard should be kept to a minimum.

Gloria would like to brainstorm on Facebook about the excess traffic. A member has suggested stickers on our cars. We have way too many visitors to make that effective also policing that would be difficult.

A point made by a long-term member was many many ways have been tried for this apparently age-old problem and there has been no success.

There are six new EV stations scheduled to be put in, in the city of South Lyon for those people who own EV s.

Jim had sent Gloria and email saying that our colonial acres was voted *Best in South Lyon* We are making a framed hanging of that email.

Member has asked for permission for Generac generator. The procedure was explained to her for installation form to be filled out license contractor to do the work then a request to the board and we will approve.

A reminder from Clearview they need a copy of the newsletter so they can post it. Why closings at the clubhouse? Stacy discussed this via zoom with the group present. It is to welcome people they can see what it is like here often times there are people coming in and out to the library. It's nice to let the new people know that there is a lot of activity here. It is difficult on a daily basis to know when a closing is coming due to the fact the real estate people often don't have their paperwork in order. They do try to avoid meetings and will look closely at the calendar to make sure there are no meeting scheduled on that day.

There was a discussion about some dead trees behind building 72 and 73 they will be looked at by Jamie and or Paul z.

Meeting closed at 2:20 p.m.

SNOW PLOWING PROCEDURE



- The daily news always lets us know about when snow is coming. Be aware when 2 or more inches will be falling.
- ➤ If 2 or more inches have fallen the roads & walkways will be cleared once snow has stopped.
- As roads & courtyard areas are cleared you should hear a horn. Be up, aware, & listening for the horn to blow or listening for the plow in your area. If it is a continuing snow & the plows will be returning do not move your cars until snow has stopped & horn is blown.
- Members should be clearing off cars & moving them once this happens. Many streets & courtyards have a plan where & when to move cars, make sure you are aware of what happens in your area. If you're new check with your neighbors about a plan.
- ➤ If roads & walkways are not cleared yet do not move your cars onto unplowed roads. Your car could be plowed in, ticketed or towed if you do.

DO NOT:

Do not park cars immediately at the ends of roads where snow will be moved.

Do not park your cars in your space **OVER** the sidewalk during winter. This prevents the sidewalks from getting completely shoveled.




