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Bylaws of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc.

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Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers in the saving grace of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ who have accepted him as their personal Saviour. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows:

Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit

Creation and Formation

Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation

Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Saviour, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.

Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body. A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by speaking in other languages.

Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Washing of Feet.

Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers. Do not condone divorce and remarriage. Matthew 19:8-9.

Destruction of the Wicked. Conditional Immortality.

Rapture of the Man Child Class.

Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly.

A Ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These basic doctrines shall be adhered to in the teaching of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

Dear Lord,



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Are They Esteemed Highly?

I Thess. 5:12-13, And we beseech you, brethren, to know them which labour among you, and are over you in the Lord, and admonish you; and to esteem them very highly in love for their work's sake. And be at peace among yourselves.

There are two important factors to know about these verses of Scripture. 1. Who is the one over you? 2. What

does to esteem highly mean?

The one who is to labour is to be known of the congregation. He is the minister, the pastor of the church. The individual is to lift Christ up among the people. He is to point souls to the one who can save, satisfy, and bless those who put their trust in Christ. The pastor is to be caring, compassionate, and prayerful for the Christian and be a burden - bearer for their needs whatever they may be. He is also to be a person who is everlooking for lost souls that are out of the ark of safety. The pastor is an over - seer, Acts 20:28, Take heed thereforth unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which He hath purchased with His own blood. In order to feed the flock or the Church, it is necessary to pray and to study the Word of God that He might feed people's souls. That will take plenty of time and plenty of effort. A minister must not have the motive of selfgain in mind. I Pet. 5:2-3, Feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight, thereof, not be constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind; Neither as being lords over God's heritage, but being ensamples to the flock. A true minister takes heed to himself when he nourishes his own soul by sound doctrine, purifies his own heart by loving obedience to the truth, strengthens his own spirit by habitual devotion, and lives in inward communion and fellowship with Jesus. There must be spiritual wisdom and understanding in the mysteries of the gospel, experience of the power of the truth, skill to divide the Word aright, and a zeal for the glory of God. The Christian service can never be other than a willing service of love. Wise authority in a Church is that which the minister can wield who loves the members, seeks their hightest well being, and is ever ready to put his own advantage, and even his own preferences, aside in order to secure it. Unwilling authority is sure to be unwise and unworthy. Impure motive is seen in using an official position for securing any personal ends. The position in Christ's Church is one of service to others. It may bring both gain and authority to the minister, but in no way should this be sought. These duties must be performed 'not be constraint' but from a willing mind that takes pleasure in the work of the Lord.

There is also a need to turn our attention to the 'esteemed very highly' for the minister's work. It is to look upon this man with high opinion, appreciation, respect, and to rate him worthwhile. That does not mean he is not human, because he is just that. The Lord calls the minister an 'anointed one'. Ps. 105:15, Saying, Touch not mine anointed, and do my prophets no harm. The minister is to come to a Church as an overseer, as a God - called man, and one who is to guide the people. We are familiar with the fact that the minister comes to the Church without a promise of a salary

to keep him for his labours. But a Church must look on a minister as one who is worthy of his hire. I Tim. 5:17-18, Let the elders that rule well be counted worthy of double honour, especially they who labour in the WORD and DOCTRINE. For the Scripture saith, Thou shalt not muzzle the ox that treadeth out the corn. And, the labourer is worthy of his reward. It is in vain to expect spiritual profit from a minister we do not respect. As a public man he is exposed to much criticism, criticism that is often thoughtless, shallow, and unfair and all such criticism tends to lower his influence with the indifferent and unspiritual. To get the highest good from the pastor the people must love and esteem him (rate him as worthwhile). Where this spirit lives, his maintenance, his reward, his needs, will be just and generous, and cheerfully rendered. he devotes his life, his powers, his all to his work (The Ministry), first for the love of his master, and then for the spiritual salvation of his people. If he ministers faithfully in holy things, he is entitled to honour and becoming support in temporal things.

Why do people feel they should receive for the labour that they would spend out on a job? If a person takes a load of wheat to the elevator, or takes beef to the sale barn, has oil and gas wells, or a business, why should he feel he is worthy of wages from these? Simply because he has laboured and is worthy of wages! A person expects to pay you for your labour, and you expect to get your income. There is nothing wrong with that attitude. It is nothing more than right,

honourable, and expected.

Should we draw a line then when it comes to the honourable support of the minister? It is not up to just a few to fulfill this obligation, but it is up to everyone to do their individual part. We must not fail to see the value of the work of the minister. We must esteem very highly (have a high opinion of, appreciation, respect, and to rate him worthwhile) the minister in financial support also! We would not fail to feed an animal that would do the work that we would need them to do. There is a responsibility of the laity as there is a responsibility of the minister. Rom. 13:4-7, For he is the minister of God to thee for good. But if thou do that which is evil, be afraid; for he beareth not the sword in vain, for he is the minister of God, a revenger to execute wrath upon his that doeth evil. Wherefore ye must needs be subject, not only for wrath, but also for conscience sake. For this cause pay ye tribute also: for they are God's ministers, attending continually upon this very thing. Render therefore to all their dues: tribute to whom tribute is due: custom to whom custom; fear to whom fear; honour to whom

There is a promise from the Word of God that is still in effect as much as it has ever been and all Christian workers need to remember. When we are doing our part in seeing to the needs of the minister, we are allowing God to impart His blessings upon us too! Mal. 3:10-11, Bring ye all the tithes into the store house, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it. And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, and he shall not destroy the fruits of your ground; neither shall your vine cast her fruit before the time in the field, saith the Lord of hosts. There are unlimited ways of looking at this Scripture. This promise is not just to the farmer, it is to the one who will honour the Lord. You will be healthier, you won't be as careless, your clothes could last longer (the Israelites lasted for 40 years), you could be wiser with your money and find

good bargains, better investments come along, and many, many more. When ALL, not PART of the TITHES are given, nothing will be held back for God has control of it all, and He can supply your need according to His riches in glory through Christ Jesus, Phil 4:19. Afterall, God has a right to the first fruits and the best of everything and He turns it around to bless us back for our being obedient to Him and His Word! Yes, Yes, if these conditions are complied with, the blessings like fruitful showers will fall upon you! There will be meat, not superfluity, for the minister who labours in the Lord's house. If we honour God with our Tithe and free will offerings, we shall not lose in this world. The windows of heaven will open and no real good will be withheld. Prov. 3:9-10, Honour the Lord with thy substance, and with the firstfruits of all thine increase: So shall thy barns be filled with plenty, and thy presses shall burst out with new wine.

We don't want it to happen as it did in Nehemiah's day. Nehemiah 13:10-12, And I perceived that the portions of the Levites had not been given them: for the Levites and the singers, that did the work were fled every one to his field. Then contended I with the rulers, and said, WHY IS THE HOUSE OF GOD FORSAKEN? And I gathered them together, and set them in their place. Then brought all Judah the tithe of the corn and the new wine and the oil, unto the treasuries. When the minister of the Lord knows that the people are standing behind him in prayer, looking for the highest good for him, and his people are supporting with their financial support, he will do all that is required of him before the Lord. That pastor will not even mind to supplement his salary with outside work, if necessary. You won't find burned out ministers nor ministers ready to find greener pastures when these conditions exist. When this kind of atmosphere exists there is contentment, peace, joy, and the good of each other is prevelant. This is when the fingers of the Gospel begins to reach out to the oppressed and people are fully blessed. God blesses our intentions when they become good works and good deeds that promote the kingdom of God. So let us as ministers feed the flock, that the Lord has purchased with His own blood, and let us as the people of the Flock esteem very highly the Lord's minister.



God Still Heals

When our oldest son Joshua was 2 1/2 weeks old he received a large dose of a prescribed drug. Within hours the drug began to take a fatal affect on him. He began breathing very fast, his coloring started to look bad. It went from rosy to pale to ashen. His eyes became glossy, his cries were feeble. You could tell he was hurting but he didn't have the strength to cry. We had to take him to a hospital 40 miles away as our hospital didn't have a pediatrician and equipment to handle the emergency at hand.

Five minutes after we reached the hospital he stopped breathing in my arms. The doctors worked on him a couple of minutes before he started to breathe again. They asked permission to run tests on him and then we didn't see him again for five hours. There were five doctors working on Joshua at this time. When the doctor came to us he was almost in tears. They had run tests, just spent five hours with him and we were told he could die at any minute. The doctor was told what medication was given to Joshua as there had been no time to ask questions earlier.

The next few days were critical. Joshua was on a breathing machine. He was given 100% oxygen but his body was only retaining 20%. He was having several seizures. His body chemistry was totally wiped out. They had to inject pure calcium through IV's. His veins couldn't handle the calcium and thus he would swell up and turn purple in the areas where the IV's were. They had them in his hands, feet, legs, and finally his head. As a last resort they were going to cut into a deeper vein but finally one of his veins in his foot took it.

During this time we were in complete despair. A year before we had lost our first child to negligence resulting in her being stillborn. We couldn't understand why we were having to endure another possible loss. But we made up our minds that we shouldn't take no for an answer. We stood upon God's promises and he led us to Ephesians 3:20-Now unto him that is able to do exceeding, abundantly above all that we ask or think according to the power that worketh within us. We stood on that promise, what followed next was amazing. Everytime we saw Joshua lying there with wires all over his body, tubes in his nose, a breathing machine breathing for him, it just tore at our hearts. It was such a helpless feeling. All we could do was pray and trust God all the way. God began performing His miracles. There were so many. About the 4th or 5th day in intensive care Joshua tried to pull the breathing tube out of his mouth, the nurses tied his hands (remember this was a 2 1/2-3 week old baby). He then proceeded to cough and gag it out. The nurses were astonished. He was then placed under a oxygen hood, but praise the Lord he was breathing on his own. Next his seizures were almost down to nothing. His body chemistry began to stabilize and return to normal. He began eating. His coloring began returning to normal. Within 5 days to a week he was out of intensive care. During all these miracles the Lord was performing, there were many interceding in Joshua's behalf. Curt and I was impressed many times to lay hands on Joshua which we did.

The doctors and nurses many times walked around shaking their heads in awe of the whole situation.

Well Joshua was going to live, Praise God. The doctors wanted to prepare us that because of all the seizures and



because Joshua had stopped breathing that he would have brain damage. We didn't receive that. There was nowhere in the whole Bible that it said God heals 20%, 40% or 60%. The God I knew heals 100% and I wasn't settling for less. His first brain scan showed some abnormality but we still wouldn't accept brain damage. Nine months later his next brain scan showed completely normal. Praise God for divine healing! Joshua has some scars on his hands and one on his leg from the calcium injections (as pure calcium burns and is equal to that of a 3rd degree burn). But to us they are gentle reminders of how good God is and the miracle of His divine healing. Our Joshua was truly touched by the hand of God.

Six Teachings of Jesus

Matt. 7:6 - 29

"Give not that which is holy unto the dogs, neither cast ye your pearls before swine, lest they trample them under their

feet, and turn again and rend you.'

These are the words of Jesus as he taught His disciples on the mountain. Matt. 5:1-2. There are no greater words than those taught by Jesus. He was the Divine Son of God and understood all things about life. He took upon Himself the form of man to be tempted in all points like as we are, so He would know how to help us in the every day problems of life. He knew hunger. He knew want. He knew satisfaction. He knew real joy. He knew tumult and He knew peace. In all points tempted as we are, yet without sin.

I have six things from the lips of Jesus. (1) How to handle the gospel. (2) How to get our needs supplied. (3) How to choose life's path. (4) How to detect false prophets. (5) How to avoid hypocrisy and (6) How to build a Christian life.

"Give not that which is holy unto dogs - neither cast ye

your pearls before swine."

Jesus does not promise to back anyone that goes out promoting the gospel. Yes, we are to tell the lost about God's plan of salvation. But we are to be directed by the Holy Ghost. There is a time and place to tell the good news. There are hungry hearts that need to hear the gospel. There are hardened hearts that are ready to rend when presented with the gospel. We cannot look into these hearts so we must rely upon the leading of the Holy Ghost and then be ready to tell the good news.

Also the good news - the gospel - God's plan of salvation is such a precious thing. Purchased by the Jewel of Heaven at a terrible price. God is not pleased with us wasting such a precious thing on hardened, unconcerned hearts. If the Holy Ghost cannot mellow their hearts with conviction we will

only antagonize them with the simple truth.

I can assure you that some will trample the beautiful story of the gospel under feet, crucifying the Saviour anew and turn and rend you. They will take you to a verbal onslaught and even do you bodily harm. Jesus simply says - "Be careful with the precious Gospel."

Verses 7 through 12. (2) How to get our needs supplied. "Ask and it shall be given you; Seek, and ye shall find; knock

and it shall be opened unto you."

I am impressed with the simplicity of Christ's teaching. A need appears. Ask God, in the name of Jesus. It is just that simple. This covers all the scope of life; spiritual; physical; large; small - what ever the need. The need is not supplied seek. It still is not supplied -knock. That's very wonderful. Just be honest hearted with God and do what He says. Ask; seek; knock. The answer will come.

To give us some assurance Jesus left a very emphatic illustration. Verses 9 through 12--

(9) "Or what man is there of you, whom if his son ask bread, will he give him a stone?

(10) "Or if he ask a fish, will he give him a serpent?

(11) "If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask him?"

Jesus concluded this with a very special point. Verse 12, "Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets."

We are not to expect others to do something for us. We are to do something for others and then we can expect something nice to come our way. This is what it is all about.

Verses 13-14 - Item 3 - How to choose life's path. "Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in there at:

(14) "Because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it."

There are only two ways. The choice is ours. It is an individual choice. No one can choose for another. The crowd is going the wide gate and broad way to destruction. The few choose the strait gate and narrow way to life. Notice the narrow way has a strait gate. That means confined. Everything must be laid aside. We have to be honest with God and Jesus to get in the strait gate and only you and Jesus can walk the narrow way.

Item number 4 - "How to detect false prophets." Verses 15-20.

(15) "Beware of false prophets, which comes to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves."

(16) "Ye shall know them by their fruits. Do men gather

grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles?"

(17) "Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit; but a corrupt tree bringeth forth evil fruit."

(18) "A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit."

(19) "Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire."

(20) "Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them."

One of the main items is to love the truth. Be honest with God. The key is verse 18 - "A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit." There is no way deceit can prosper. Eventually the truth will out. A good tree cannot bear evil fruit. It is just that simple. A corrupt tree cannot bear good fruit. The words of Jesus are so wonderful. And they are so simple.

Item number 5 - How to avoid hypocrisy. Verses 21

through 23.

(21) "Not every on that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the Kingdom of Heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven." (22) "Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord have we not prophesied in they name? And in thy name have cast out devils? And in thy name done many wonderful works?"

(23) "And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you;

depart from me, ye that work iniquity."

This is hypocrisy - professing to know God and not knowing God in reality. It takes more than belief in God. The devils believe they know that Jesus is the Christ. It takes more than that. Anyone can say Jesus is the Christ. He rightly is but to say Jesus is the Christ by the Holy Ghost means much, much more. It means a cleansing of the heart. A personal knowledge and acquaintance with Jesus. You see without knowing Jesus they are hypocrites and Jesus does not know them.

Item number 6 - How to build a Christian Life. Verses 24-27.

(24) "Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings or mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock;"

(25) "And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell not: for

it was founded upon a rock."

(26) "And every one that heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them not, shall be likened unto a foolish man, which built his house upon the sand."

(27) "And the rain descended, and the floods came, and beat upon that house; and it fell and great was the fall of it."

The secret here is to dig down to the rock - the Rock Jesus Christ. Then use good material, gold, silver, precious stone. Something that will stand the test. The test of Fire. It is not difficult to understand that building on the sand and using wood, hay or second rate material is not good. Give God your best. Put your entire being into service for Jesus. The bottom line is this: time will tell how we have built.

Jesus had a doctrine. It was the doctrine of God. Jesus came to do the will of the Father. He did just that. His simple words hold the answer to life's problems. He still teaches with authority. I love the simple teachings of Christ.
