Greetings from Berks Heim.

Here is the latest update from our County Home. Following the guidelines for facilities such as BH, they could begin scheduled visitations as long as there were no positive test results for two consecutive weeks for both residents and staff. That's a lot of people. But they did it. So they started scheduling outdoor visitations through the Social Service or Activity staff members. That continued successfully for approximately 3 weeks. Due to the change of weather they were preparing to have visits indoors in conference rooms or the auditorium following all the CDC guidelines. On October 16, three staff members tested positive. There were many visits scheduled for that weekend and so there were many disappointed residents and families.

There are three phases: Red, Yellow, and Green. There are three units where the positive staff were present and are now considered "Yellow". They are continuing visitations OUTSIDE only for the other units not affected by the positive results.

The Youth have received many donations for the Wernersville project. This year we were given the option to just donate the money to the Wernersville State Hospital and they will disperse the money instead of going shopping like other years. STATE SESSION REPORT - 2020

- > Jennifer Beamon, Hamburg Grange, was one of four who received an Individual Distinguished Community Service pin from the National Grange Community Service department.
- The following received special recognition for reports submitted in the Creative Connections report that replaced the usual Community Night Report due to the coronavirus issue.

Small Category – Tammy Schaeffer, Pioneer Grange – first place

Small Category – Jennifer Beamon, Hamburg Grange – third place

Large Category – Lorrie Wesner, Ontelaunee Grange – first place

- > Ontelaunee Grange received third place in the Large Category for their Community Service Report.
- Nettie Kauffman received first place for submission of the Pomona Lecturer/Program Coordinator report and scrapbook for Berks County.
- ➤ A total of 83 Subordinate delegates representing 47 Granges were in attendance. The total of Pomona delegates was 29 representing 17 different Pomona Granges.

NOTE: Apology is made if any particular individual/Grange was missed who was recognized for an achievement.

Synopsis of the session – by President, Nettie Kauffman

- This was a session which was quite different from all those held in the past. As a delegate representing Berks County Pomona Grange, we were assigned a seat at a table (which I shared with Subordinate delegate Irvin Kauffman!) and had to utilize that seating location for the full time spent in the session. Yes, masks were worn throughout the session and wherever we went in the hotel. The only type of activities completed were the business side of the order Resolutions, Budget, Election and Installation of Officers. All contests, banquets, and social activities were eliminated this year. Hopefully, the session will be back to its normal agenda in 2021 when Berks County is a part of the hosting committee for the Southeast Division.
- A total of 26 resolutions were presented for debate, changes and approval. Berks County had six resolutions (some from the individual Granges) submitted for action. Four of the resolutions were adopted as amended, one was present policy and one was rejected.

Adopted as amended (amended information included in text):

- a. To require the County of Origin, as well as the Country of Processing, on the labels of all meat products.
- b. That any land owned by the Game Commission that is taken out of cultivation be properly planted with non-invasive plant species, grasses or young trees to produce a proper habitat for wildlife and that the Game Commission be required to inhibit the growth of noxious weeds.
- c. Any animal that is used as a service animal must go through proper training and certification and owners must carry documentation to that effect when they bring the animal to public places.
- d. That when a couple divorces and one spouse has been arrested or convicted of a crime, the other spouse should be exempt from any costs related to the alleged crime and incurred by the arrested or convicted spouse.
- ➤ The 2021-2022 Proposed Budget was adopted with no increase in the dues structure.
- > The Installation of Officers was done in a completely different format since the "social distancing" was followed.
- Each county should appoint a chairperson to work with the 150th Anniversary Committee slated for 2023 in Reading, PA.

An invitation was extended from the Southeast Region 2021 Hosting Committee Chairperson, Terry Murray. The 2021 State Grange Session will be held at the Valley Forge Casino Resort from October 14 - 17, 2021. Berks County is part of this hosting region.
