Stewardship

Jesus warns us in the Gospel of Matthew, "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." It is an invitation to a way of life, and a plan that leads to holiness. But make no mistake, it is a warning as well. The cross is a sign of victory, but only in light of the Resurrection. Alone, it is a symbol of ultimate sacrifice: the sacrifice of Jesus Christ for a fallen world, and the sacrifice we are called to make to truly follow him.

But the cross is something so much more. It is a reminder of the pain, suffering, and death of one who loved us so much that he would give his very life for us. It is our God on that cross. It is God who cries out in despair, feeling the ultimate depth of human emotion. And there lies the key for us in trying to live this life of carrying our crosses. He has walked in all our shoes, and now we are called to walk in his. In the cross, we find solidarity with the human condition. In an empty tomb, we find our hope.

Diocesan Bulletin Bite: Palm Sunday

"Rather, let the greatest among you be as the youngest, and the leader as the servant."

In the year 2002 Robert Greenleaf caused a stir in management circles when he proposed the concept or "Servant Leadership" in a book by that title. He was in big demand as a motivational speaker. But two thousand years earlier Jesus taught us to lead by serving, to lead by example. It was a concept that was unknown to the people in the time of Jesus. They were looking for a strong and charismatic person to lead them in a military conquest over the Romans. And, after two thousand years of Christianity, the concept leading by serving obviously seemed novel to many people when Greenleaf proposed it. But we Christians should know it. We are disciples of Jesus. We have learned about his life as a servant from Scripture and the teachings of the Church. We have the example of Jesus and the Apostolic Fathers and many saints who were models of leading others to Christ by serving. It was not easy for Jesus or the apostles or the saints. It won't be easy for us. But it is the "way, the truth and the life" we are called to.
