The SHUMC Shawl Ministry is a group of women who enjoy knitting and crocheting in service to our Lord. We supply our church, Lakeland Hospice, North East Hospice and Great Lakes Hospice with blankets and shawls.

We give baptism blankets to babies baptized in our church.

We provide hats and scarves for the City Mission and The Refuge. All homemade items are given free of charge to the recipients. Donations of yarn (any kind – but preferably Red Heart brand) are greatly appreciated. Currently, we are in need of white baby yarn. Cash donations are accepted, also.



The 6th annual shoe drive is underway. We will be actively collecting new and gently used shoes through July. The proceeds from this event will benefit the ministries of the EUMA and All God's Children Ministries. We are asking for your help to make this event successful again this year. We have been offered a bonus if we can fill 1,400 bags of shoes this year. We filled just over 1,300 last year so that goal is within reach.

You'll find rubberbands to put around each pair of shoes on the Connections table in the Fellowship Hall and in the narthex you'll find a box to put the shoes in.

Harry Denman Evangelism Award

Harry Denman was a noted Methodism lay leader and evangelist within the Methodist Church who emphasized the life taught by Jesus at the Sermon on the Mount. Denman exemplified and taught a simple life, by personally relating to all people. His personal property was very limited; he usually had only one pair of shoes and refused to wear a watch, preferring to ask for the time as a way of starting a conversation. Articles given to him were given away to the needy. He was born in 1893 in Birmingham, Alabama. He had a bachelor's degree from Birmingham-Southern College and a master's degree in social work. In 1939, he became the General Secretary of the General Board of Evangelism.

Denman was among a group of Methodists who helped incorporate The Foundation for Evangelism. He was also instrumental in establishing the International Prayer Fellowship.

After retiring in 1965, he traveled extensively preaching and conducting evangelistic meetings. He died in 1976 at the age of 83.

The Harry Denman Evangelism Award program honors United Methodists in each annual conference whose exceptional ministry of evangelism – expressed in Word (what), Sign (why), and Deed (how) – brings people into a lifetransforming relationship with Jesus Christ.

Evangelism happens in many contexts and many settings; impacts and engages all generations; and requires relationship among a variety of persons.

What distinguishes a Harry Denman Evangelism Award recipient is the commitment to consistently introduce others to the Good News of Jesus Christ in all ministry settings. Their ministry is exceptional for the number of new Christ Followers who credit encounters with this person as critical in helping to start or reignite their faith journey.

Each year Annual Conferences and the Foundation for Evangelism recognize one youth, one clergy, and one lay person in each conference.

This year, South Harborcreek United Methodist Church's Rev. Keith McGarvey has received the Harry Denman Evangelism Award. The Erie-Meadville District Superintendent, Rev. Joe Patterson will be at SHUMC on Sunday, June 3 to present the award.




Save the Date: Movie Night June 10th, 2018 5:00 p.m.




