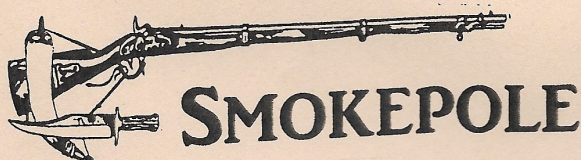

APRIL MEETING: We had a good program by a representative from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife about hunting. The presentation included a video that was informative and entertaining.

APRIL SHOOT: We were on the Big Bore range this month due to other activities at the same time. Nine shooters turned out. There are no scores because they shot at clangers which seem to be in a "who cares" category. I discovered that range has its own score shack which is big enough we had our potluck there for those who stayed for it. Folks liked the beans Bob and I brought and I didn't think to tell them that in addition to the commercial chili in the pot there were Arikara beans Bob grew last year. This is a strain the Lewis and Clark expedition liked and got in trade from the Mandan Indians for a food supply and on the return trip they got more to give to Thomas Jefferson who grew them in his garden at Monticello. Bob discovered them there and bought a packet of seeds to try.

MONTHLY SHOOT – HELP WANTED! The FUMML shooting activity at the EEGC has been a steady success and we are earning our keep by providing an opportunity for EEGC members who shoot muzzleloaders and the general public to enjoy competition with us. Now we need a plan for keeping the effort fun for everyone by not expecting the same person(s) to be in charge of every shoot and magically appear every month. EEGC has us scheduled for the last Saturday of each month this year. I plan to be at this month's shoot and can buy paper targets if necessary but I don't have a name of a person to conduct the shoot. Last year we took the summer off (officially) and the shoots happened anyway, somehow, but a little more structure would be helpful. The McKenzie Raiders had a system that worked really well – members would pair up and pick a month to put on a shoot together, selecting targets and matches and sometimes providing prizes. Steve Gilmore is doing June - who will take May? Call me!

MOOSE MILK RECIPES (Should you explain to pilgrims you don't actually milk a lady moose to get this....?)

Moose Milk – use a typical 1 oz shot glass
1 shot water soluble oil (Balistol)
1 shot Pinesol
2 shots hydrogen peroxide – 3 % solution
20 shots water
2 shots alcohol if freezing temps expected

Moose Milk
4 oz castor oil
1 oz Murphy's Oil Soap
4 oz Witch Hazel
8 oz Isopropyl alcohol (91%)
16 oz bottles water (non-chlorinated)

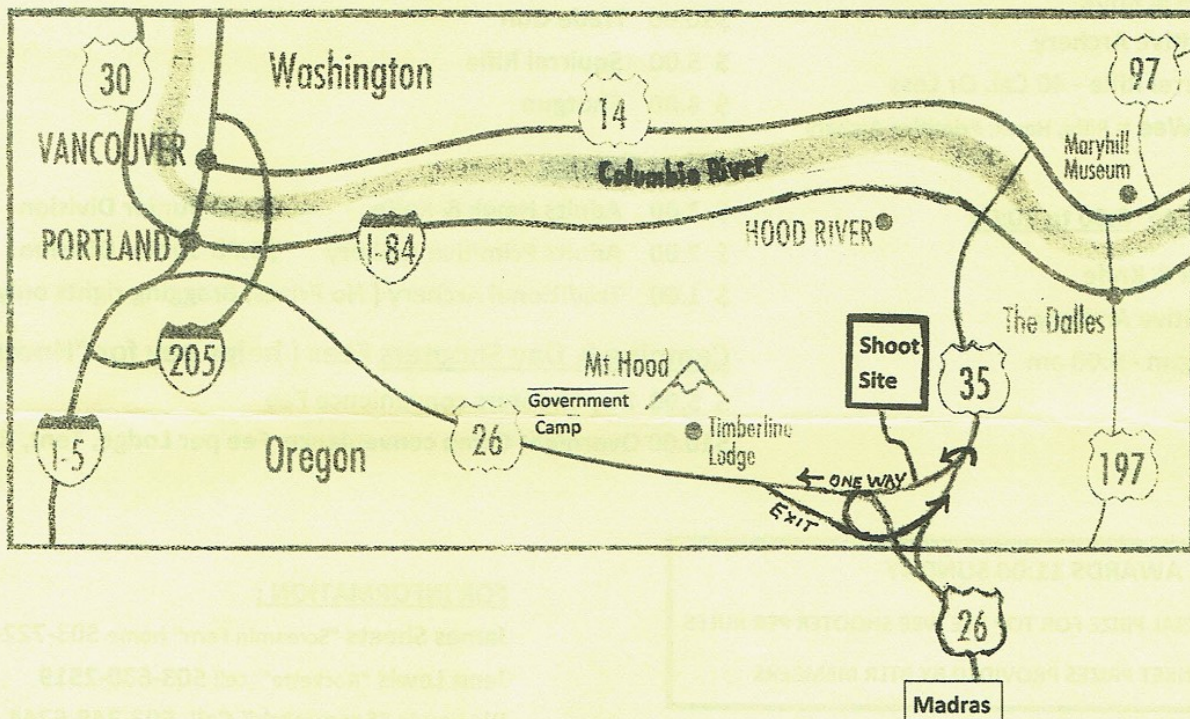

- Primitive Rifle Trail walk, extra 5 points for primitive attire, 3 pieces: shirt, pants, head gear or foot wear
- No more than two shooters per gun.
- Shooters meeting at 8:00 am Friday & Saturday

Other Information

We are privileged to be here at this beautiful private ranch. Please follow these rules while you are here:

- Two Camping areas available: Primitive and Non Primitive. These are the only areas you can camp. Ask if you have questions where you can be before setting up.
- All pets must be tied up or kept on a leash.
- Pick up after your animals (nobody likes stepping in it)
- Pack in – Pack out. Keep your area clean and picked up.
- Absolutely NO loading or loaded firearms in camp.
- This is a family sport we all want to have fun, Please watch your language and conduct.
- Especially please know where Your Children are at all times you are responsible for their safety.
- Dry Camp, bring your own water.
- All fires have to be in an above ground fire pit.
- Map on back

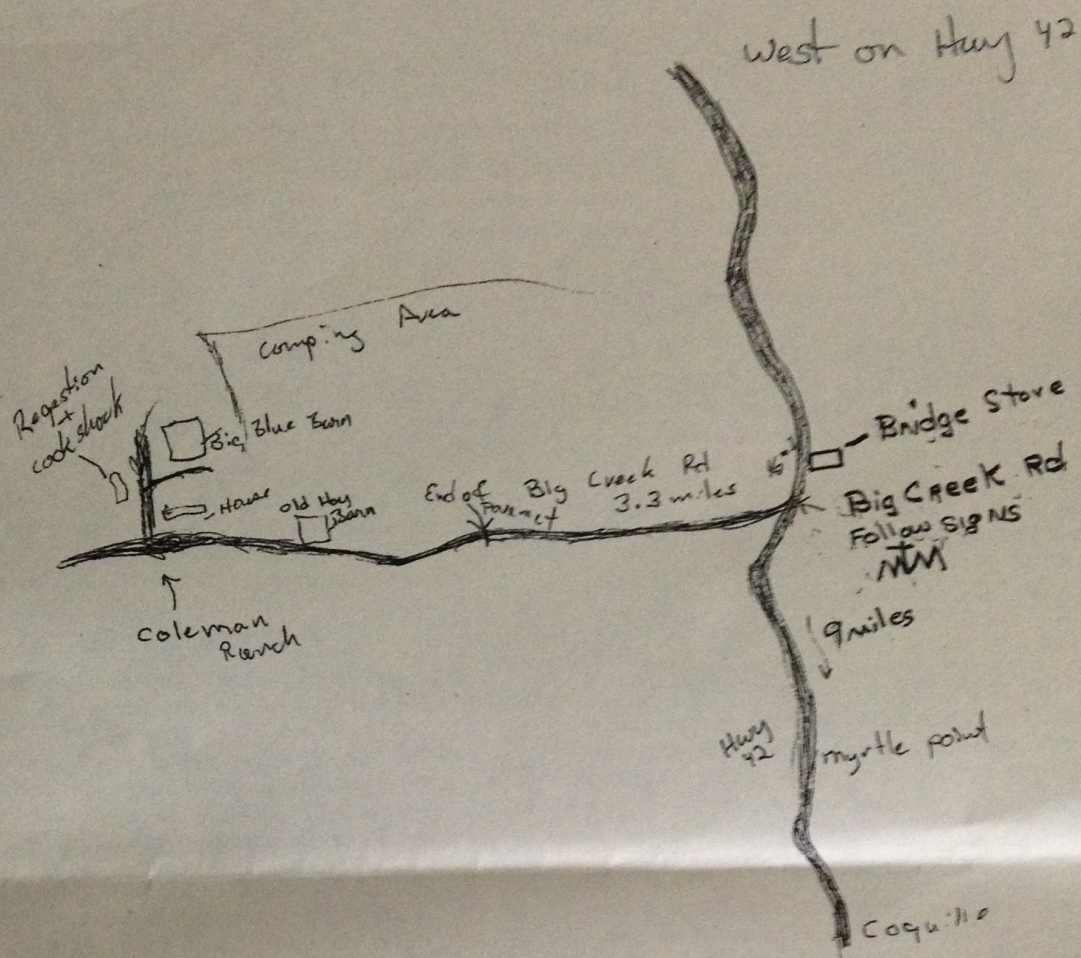
