

REFLECTION for the First Sunday in Advent

As we begin again the season of Advent, we marvel at the big picture-view presented by Isaiah. He, like all of us 21st century Christians, is looking forward to *'the days to come'*, to the future when God will finally establish his Kingdom. *All the nations of the world will stream to it, to worship God in His Temple, to know His ways and to walk in His paths.* It will be a time of justice and peace, a time of total fulfilment for all. No swords, only ploughshares. Yes, he is using words and images appropriate for his time. In our time, we are challenge to dream the dream, to fix our gaze, to hope, and to put our trust in the coming of our Messiah. Our life in the Kingdom can and will be marvelous, it will knock our socks off.

As we begin again the season of Advent, we marvel at the possibilities in our world. Let our imaginations run wild, fill our hearts and minds with the joys of our ultimate future basking in the Beatific Vision. Sure, the reality of today's world is startling- some people still flock to the Church, some believe they are persecuted by it, and some have just taken to ignoring it.

Faith, and its companion, salvation, are personal choices. We have free-will. Each year Advent comes and Christmas is in the air. For Christians, it is a time to spruce-up our souls, to shine-up our commitment to Jesus, and to recharge our divine heaven-programmed internal batteries. We will attend carol services, seek out penitential services, and anticipate; like children we can't wait, there are gifts galore awaiting the faithful Christian. But wait we must. Waiting can refresh, can enflame hope, and can sprout love.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus warns us to be ready for what he calls *'the coming of the Son of Man'*. The Son of Man is continually present among us though we often fail to recognise him. We must.

Jesus is urging us to be aware. In the days of Noah, He says, people went about their ordinary business unaware of the judgement awaiting them. In a similar way, the coming of the Son of Man is awaiting us as sure s we live and move and have our being. Some will be ready for it, some will not. If you are not prepared, you will suffer the consequences. Ponder these, let them scare us straight.

If we are prepared, if we accept Jesus, then He will welcome us, which is a gift and a grace from God. If, on the other hand, we are unprepared, if we reject, then we reap the consequences: frustration, misery, hate. That old gift of free-will could end up damning us. Let us look to the Incarnation for hope.

Jesus' unconditional love for each one of us gives us the confidence to make every day of our lives a day to turn away from sin and back to the Lord, to allow the Holy Spirit to liberate us from that deadly indifference to God's will for us.

The *'coming of the Son of Man'* need not be a future event. All the time the Son of Man is coming to us. He is always present with us and we are being challenged to accept or reject Him. Advent is the time when we think about this especially, when we try to open our lives to his coming, to the indwelling Spirit of His love and forgiveness. It is a time when we strive to accept the good and reject the bad, so that we become more and more like the Son of Man.

This Advent is *another* opportunity for change. It is a time of new beginning. Don't delay, and don't become complacent, thinking that Advent comes around every year. This may be our last Advent. It certainly will be for many. God is giving us another chance to respond to His amazing love for us before death steals upon us and we slip away, scarcely noticed, into divine judgment. Pray and take action that in the words of today's psalm, we can truly rejoice when we hear it said *'Let us go to God's house'*.
