

CCA Middle School Outdoor Classroom Receives Grant

The Clear Creek Amana Middle School in Tiffin has been chosen as one of 28 Iowa organizations to receive a Wellmark Foundation Matching Assets to Community Health (MATCH) grant/ The CCA project received \$13,583 for its outdoor classroom project contingent upon them obtaining a 50 percent match to the grant.

The Clear Creek Amana Middle School Outdoor Classroom proposes to take an under-used space near the learning annex between the High School and the Middle School and transform it into a space that is welcoming to all ages. It will allow science classes, art, FFA, for example, to head outdoors for learning activities and for PE to explore physical activities beyond traditional sports. Students will have enhanced hands-on curriculum related to food production, food consumption and physical education. They are planning an outdoor "learning shelter" with shade and seating suitable for group meetings. Also in the plans, vegetable gardens and a "fern gully" for the study of soils and botany along with a small, short-grass prairie.

"The Wellmark Foundation is proud to see all of the outstanding work communities are doing during these challenging times," said Mary Lawyer, The Wellmark Foundation executive director. "These projects will not only provide the groundwork for access to and consumption of nutritious foods but also opportunities for physical activity within their communities — both of which will enhance the quality of life and the overall well-being of citizens for generations to come."

Since 2011, The Wellmark Foundation has provided more than \$11 million in grant funding to communities across Iowa and South Dakota.
