#### FROM THE PASTOR

It may seem that if the gospel of Matthew is the first book of the New Testament, then it must be the book that was written first. But the books of the New Testament are NOT in chronological order. (Just a point of information: The first thing written in the New Testament is Paul's first letter to the church at Thessalonica which was written in the 50s and the Gospel of Matthew was written in the 80s.)

And so from the earliest New Testament writing, 1 Thessalonians 3:12 we read this: "May the Lord cause you to increase and enrich your love for each other and for everyone in the same way as we also love you. May the love cause your hearts to be strengthened."

Wow, I want my heart to be strengthened in love! So, I commend this scripture to you for this season of Advent and Christmas. We find ourselves in unbelievable times in our country. I bet you, like me, are not anxious for holiday get-togethers that come with discussions involving religion and politics. The impetus for debate becomes a battle-field, and so we often hear the phrase "pick your battles."

I am indebted to Dr. Karoline Lewis for her frank comments on this subject. Events in life can be stressful, especially around the holidays, right? If you think that religion and politics are recent issues that can rip people apart, think again. These subjects have started many a debate over thousands of years.

Dr. Lewis makes a case that "our metaphors shape how we live." Intriguing, right? Currently in our country, world, families, churches, etc., we find ourselves in the trap of 'victory' at all costs. Wow, we are diving in headfirst to declare who is right and who is wrong and ultimately who wins. Why is winning the end all and be all for us human beings? Compete, compete, compete!! Is this our mantra? What is it inside us that we need to be superior - the true winner because that is what matters? It breeds suspicion, discord, distrust, and underhanded dealings. BLECK! I have been there, have you?

"On Sunday November 25<sup>th</sup> US Customs and Border Agents fired the chemical agent CS gas at mostly Honduran migrants attempting to cross into the United States from Tijuana, Mexico. This is an unusual escalation of lobbing weapons over an international border at unarmed civilians, men, women, children, seeking refuge.

"Using CS gas, a chemical weapon, has been outlawed on the battlefield by nearly every nation on Earth, including the United States. Chemical weapons are indiscriminate and are uniquely terrorizing in their application. Women and children choking on teargas, running in fear. People seeking peace and asylum are being met with violence and fear."

Love must work in our hearts EVERY DAY.

Speak up, Act boldly, Love unconditionally.

I pray for us to follow God's Kingdom and Jesus' example, love your neighbor as yourself, offer a cup of cold water, welcome the immigrant and sojourner in your midst. Make this your journey for Advent.

Answers to this question were quite varied. People expressed satisfaction with the church's ministry. One person pointed out the importance of maintaining "a balance of internal spiritual growth through worship and small group participation with the external expression of Christian values and love through community involvement." Another said, "I love being a part of a church that reaches in as well as out."

A couple of people commented on the church's relationship with the children of the church. One parent expressed gratitude for the church's effort to meet child care needs, as well as going "out of their way to care for us." Another commented on the ways this church accepts all kids, including kids who are different, with the annual Christmas program providing a great example. "All our kids are able to participate in the ways that work for them without someone shushing or giving them the evil eye."

In general, people who replied to this question were very satisfied with the church. Comments included:

I think we all need to feel important and vital in some aspect of the church's life.

There is indeed profound grace in my life because of TUMC.

What a wonderful congregation we are. I feel so loved and supported.

I love the songs we sing in worship, but sometimes I think we should limit the number of verses.

The host church is where the families will stay for a week before they move to another location the next week until they can find housing. As support church we will help provide meals for the week, interact with the families and children after dinner, and possible spend the night if needed. As a support church, TUMC will provide funds to help support Family Promise.
