- Virtual Policy 2020: TRIO United for A New Era March 22<sup>nd</sup>-March 24<sup>th</sup>

- Council for Opportunity in Education (COE) submitted a proposal to President-Elect Biden and his transition team for the Education Department and the Office of management and Budget that calls for increased TRIO funding over five years, linking any increases in the Pell



Grant to increases in TRIO funding, expanding TRIO eligibility to serve DACA students, and other recommendations to improve college access.

- The Department of Education sent a letter to all TRIO programs on Friday December 4<sup>th</sup> updating the continued flexibilities

- COVID-19: Congress has restarted negotiations of COVID-19 relief bill
  - This week, a bipartisan group of senators introduced a plan with \$908 billion for COVID-19 relief (funded partly by unspent CARES Act funding), including \$82 billion for education, \$4 billion for student loan relief, \$10 billion for child care, and \$10 billion for broadband.
  - The bill text has not been finalized and the education funding allocations for specific programs have not yet been determined.
  - Senators Joe Manchin (D-WV), Susan Collins (R-ME), Mitt Romney (R-UT), Mark Warner (D-VA), Bill Cassidy (R-LA), Jeanne Shaheen (D-NH), Lisa Murkowski (R-AK), Angus King (I-ME) and Maggie Hassan (D-NH) introduced the framework.

# Pre-College Programs

- The Department of Education re-published its draft notice for comments on the Talent Search application package that were utilized in the 2015-16 competition. As the Department of Education followed the same procedure in the 2019-20 Student Support Services competition, it is believed that the agency has re-issued this notice in order to eliminate the need to publish a draft for the upcoming 2020-21 competitions.
  - This means:
    - We can expect a short, 30-45 day turnaround between the release of the 2020-21 RFPs and the proposal due dates, and
    - The competitive preference priorities included in the drafts just released will be different.

- COE expects the application to be due at the end of January
- Only the TOP two Prior Experience scores will be used in this upcoming competition. The lowest score will be discarded. ED will consider increasing the stipend limits for UB and UBMS.
- ED will consider proposals from Talent Search to provide stipends to participants. Stipend increases or requests need prior written approval from their program specialists.
- UB and UBMS APR currently open and will close December 18<sup>th</sup>.
