ALBION W. PALMER, D.D.S. - Company E, 31st Georgia Infantry

Born May 5, 1845, in Washington, GA.

In the summer of 1863, Albion Palmer joined Company E, 31st GA Infantry at Orange Court House, VA, after the Pennsylvania campaign, and was at once assigned to duty in the regimental band. He served in this capacity until the army of Northern Virginia was disbanded, also on various occasions acting on staff duty for General Gordon or General C.A. Evans, his brigade commander.

He took part in the battles of the Wilderness, Spotsylvania Court House, and Cold Harbor, Early's Maryland and Shenandoah valley campaigns, the defense of Petersburg, and the last march to Appomattox.

After the war, he devoted himself to the science of dentistry, obtained a professional education at the University of Tennessee, and engaged in the practice at Chattanooga. He also became a professor of Dentistry in various colleges.
