South Yorkshire Federation of WIs News 'n' Views



After last year's successful mass lobby of parliament on Climate Change, over 100 WI members lobbied their MPs as part of this year's event organised by the Climate Coalition, of which NFWI is a member. This time, due to Coronavirus, instead of meeting in person, it was a virtual lobby via Zoom and nearly 300 MPs were contacted.

Members asked their MPs to commit to a green and fair economic recovery post Covid-19. They emphasised the need for investment in green jobs and infrastructure and also asked MPs to protect, restore and expand our green and wild spaces and to support those most vulnerable to the impacts of climate change and coronavirus, both at home and abroad.

During the pandemic, many of us have realised how important the natural world is to our mental and physical well-being and feel that this pause in our lives offers us the chance to acknowledge this and build back something better than we had before. With this in mind, Susan Webster (dual member Cantley with Branton WI and Bawtry WI) and Gillian McCallum (Bawtry WI and Climate Ambassador) met their MP, Nick Fletcher to explain the 'asks' detailed above and suggest how, if implemented by the Government, these could be benefit our area. We had a short but interesting

discussion on how both Government and individuals could play their part in helping to ensure we meet the Government's target of net zero emissions by 2050 at the latest.

Nick Fletcher tweeted about our meeting using #TheTimeIsNow and promised to write to the Environment Secretary to tell him of our support for a green recovery. We will be following up on this in due course to keep up the pressure.

TREASURER'S CORNER EXTENSION OF PRO-RATA SUBSCRIPTION INTO 2021

You will be aware that on 2nd July 2020, NFWI confirmed that there is a 3-month extension to this year's membership subscription. The next renewal date for membership subscriptions will be 1st April 2021. And, from this point onwards, membership renewals will always be in April. If you missed it, the NFWI notification can be found in the News Section of SYFWI Website (http://www.southyorksfedwi.org.uk/news.html)

This is how the pro-rata membership will work with the proposed new payment date: The pro-rata fees will remain the same, members who join from January to March 2021 will pay the same rate as those who joined in the quarter 1 October to 31 December 2020.

Members who join anytime between 1 October 2020 – March 2021 will pay the pro-rata subscription rate of £10.75 and their full membership will be next due for renewal in April 2021. The distribution also remains the same.

But Remember, as usual, the pro-rata subscription only applies to someone who is new to the WI or has not been a member in the last 10 years.

Yorkshire WI Recipe Book

This months recipe was sent in by an anonymous WI member.

Chocolate Coconut Biscuits

Ingredients:

4oz Margarine

20z Sugar

2 Tsp Cocoa 1 Cup (3oz) Coconut

1 Cup (3oz) self raising flour

Method:

Soften the margarine and cream with the sugar. Work in the remaining ingredients and put thinly in a greased tin. Bake for 25 minutes in a moderate oven Regulo 4. Cut when cold.

Remember these instructions are from the pre 1983 recipe book so the information needs to be updated to modern measures and temperatures.
