Description of class

Make this “Summery” 32” x 26” wall hanging in a one day class, using the pattern, “Turtle Beach” by Sue Pritt.

Techniques of simple piecing, fusible web machine appliqué and quilting as you go.

Skill Level

Moderate to advanced.

Number of Students

8 to 10

Supply List for “Turtle Beach”

Backing & Batting – 36” x 30”

Tan (outside border & binding) - 1/2 yard

Light Turquoise (inside border) - 6” x WOF

Light Turquoise (surf water) - 26½”w x 2½”h

Dark Turquoise (distant ocean) - 26½”w x 1½”h

Light Blue (sky) - 26½”w x 4½”h

Beige (sand) - 26 ½”w x 13½”h

White (waves, lighthouse, bird) - 18”w x 5”h

Dark Grey (dune fence, bird) - 6” x 4”

Light Grey (fence) - 18” x 9”

Black (lighthouse, bird) - 2”x 4”

Light Moss Green (dune grass & rosehip bush) - 1 fat quarter (18” x 21”)

Pink (rosehip flowers) - 4” x 3”

Medium Brown (turtles, rocks & chickadee) - 9” x 4”

Dark Brown (turtles) - 9” x 6”

8 sheets paper backed fusible web (Print-N-Fuse OR lite Heat & Bond)

Sewing machine with piecing foot, walking foot & free motion foot.

Usual sewing supplies

Jump Start directions for “Turtle Beach

Inside Borders – cut 3 strips, 1” by WOF (width of fabric – at least 42” wide)

Outside Borders – cut 3 strips, 3” by WOF

Binding – Cut 3 strips – 1½” x WOF (*this is for single fold binding*)

Background fabrics –

Cut Sky – 26½”w x 4½”h

Cut Ocean – 26½”w x 1½”h

Cut Surf – 26½”w x 2½”h

Cut Sand - 26½”w x 13½”h

You may sew them together with quarter inch seams – see directions on page one.

Place everything in one large ziptop baggie.

If you have done fusible web appliqué before you may want to get a jump start on fusing and cutting, HOWEVER, the following directions are *ONLY* if you feel comfortable doing some things on your own.

Trace OR photocopy all the appliqué patterns from pages 3 thru 10, onto the paper side of fusible web sheets. Use either a light fusible web for tracing – OR – Use “printable” fusible web sheets with your inkjet printer.

☛ **Do NOT trace or photocopy page 11.**

That page is a placement guide, and not appliqué patterns!

Cut the fusible web sheet sections apart on the dashed lines.

Fuse the entire sections to the *WRONG* side of your fabrics.

The sections will state the color of fabric **AND** the size of fabric required.

Cut out the shapes (pieces) and place them in ziplock baggies according to their “part” number. Example – all “C” pieces in one baggie – all “FG” pieces in one baggie, etc., etc. Pieces without part numbers should be placed in one large baggie.
