Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God (Romans 13:1).

Dear Friends in Christ,

This month, I want to talk about *Presbyterian Polity*, or how we govern ourselves. At Mars UP Church, we have two elected bodies – the Session (comprised of Ruling Elders) and Deacons.

Here are some definitions, from our Constitution, *The Book of Order:*

Deacon: "The ministry of deacon as set forth in Scripture is one of compassion, witness, and service, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for the poor, the hungry, the sick, the lost, the friendless, the oppressed, those burdened by unjust policies or structures, or anyone in distress. Persons of spiritual character, honest repute, exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, sincere compassion, and sound judgment should be chosen for this ministry."

Ruling Elder: "Ruling elders are so named not because they "lord it over" the congregation (Matthew 20:25), but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life. Ruling elders, together with [Ministers], exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as well as the whole church, including ecumenical relationships. When elected by the congregation, they shall serve faithfully as members of the Session."

Deacons and Elders are elected by the congregation, but they do not have "constituencies." Our leaders do not represent certain age groups, genders, or geographic areas; in their deliberations, they vote their conscience. On the other hand, as *servant leaders*, they are encouraged to keep their ears open to the opinions and feelings in the congregation. Further, they should be present and available to those they serve – this means participating in the work and worship of the church (hard to be a servant leader if you're not around!)

What about Authority and Responsibility? Our *Book of Order* is quite clear about who has, *and who does not have* authority, and who is responsible for what.

The Congregation's authority: "Business to be transacted at meetings of the congregation shall be limited to matters related to the following:

- a. electing ruling elders, deacons, and trustees;
- b. calling a pastor, co-pastor, or associate pastor;
- c. changing existing pastoral relationships, by such means as reviewing the adequacy of and approving changes to the terms of call of the pastor or pastors, or requesting, consenting to, or declining to consent to dissolution;
- d. buying, mortgaging, or selling real property;
- e. requesting the presbytery to grant an exemption as permitted in this Constitution
- f. approving a plan for the creation of a joint congregational witness, or amending or dissolving the joint congregational witness."

What about the Pastor's authority? Again, from the *Book of Order*: "The Pastor has certain responsibilities which are not subject to the authority of the Session. [Regarding] worship, the pastor is responsible for:

the selection of Scripture lessons to be read;

the preparation and preaching of the sermon or exposition of the Word;

the prayers offered on behalf of the people and those prepared for the use of the people in worship;

the music to be sung (in coordination with the Choir Director);

the use of drama, dance, and other art forms."

Essentially, the Pastor only has authority (or responsibility) for things related to worship. As you read above, the congregation also has limited authority. So outside the congregation and the pastor, we can conclude that *Session is responsible for everything else*.

So why am I taking the time to go through all this? I hope you are still reading!

As your Pastor, I certainly have experience and opinions, but decisions are made by the Session, and by the congregation as noted above. And unless the Session *specifically decides* to give me authority for something, I don't have it.

Mars UP Church is not congregational – we are *Presbyterian*. The Presbyterian form of government is representative and consultative. Leaders are elected out of the body, and the membership agrees to *submit to the authority* of the leaders. An important part of leadership is *followership*.

ALL THAT BEING SAID, LET ME EMPHASIZE SOMETHING: I fully realize improvements can be made regarding how we get things done, and how we communicate with each other. Everyone agrees we need to have more trust and transparency. Perfection may not be possible, but things can, should, and will be done better in the future. But please be patient.

As we move forward through this Interim time, I want everyone to be clear regarding who has authority, and who does NOT. And as Paul reminds us, we are all under the authority of Christ, who is the Head of the Church.

If we strive to follow the words of the Apostle, the Body of Christ called Mars UP Church will be much healthier.



My School Preschool update...

On April 3rd Mars U.P. Church entered into an agreement with Dutilh Methodist Church wherein Dutilh will transfer My School Preschool (MSPS) to MUP after the end of the preschool's current school year -May 23, 2018. After that date MSPS will officially be part of MUP and will begin moving the school to our Church. The preschool teachers will be busy this summer, painting, etc. to ready the rooms upstairs for the start of school in September. Previously scheduled HVAC improvements will be completed this Spring. A safety locking system will also be added to both sets of doors on the second floor.

The MSPS Board of Directors will be comprised of seven members: three will be interested parents or friends of the preschool and four will be MUP members. The initial MUP Board members are: Alma Staskiewicz, Susan Cox, Marie Matthews and Herb Wellman. The Board meetings are scheduled for the second Monday of the month. The first Board meeting was held on April 9th to begin the transition process.
