

Death of Mrs. Anna Gramann.

Mrs. Anna Marie Steiner Gramann, widow of Henry Gramann, a native of Schwammelwitz, Schlesien, Germany, aged 75 years, died at her home in the southern part of the city yesterday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock after a brief illness. Mrs. Gramann was a woman of beautiful character and rare talents. Her death came as a great shock to her many friends and acquaintances, few of whom knew that the grand old lady was even ill. She was a resident of Victoria for sixty years, and sang the first mass in old St. Mary's Catholic Church. Five children survive her: Mrs. J. C. Beasley, of Beeville, and Mrs. August Klein, Misses Minnie and Ida Gramann and H. C. Gramann, all of this city. She is also survived by a sister, Mrs. Frederick Schob, of Raisin, this county. The funeral took place from Our Lady of Lourdes Church this afternoon at 3:30 o'clock, and was largely attended. Rev. L. Etschenberg officiated, and the interment was made in the Evergreen Cemetery.
