need to be left on the curb. Instead they will be picked up with regular household trash, which is currently a maximum of 6 bags not exceeding 40 pounds per pickup. Please advise your landscape contractor of this change. Tree trimmings and branches will continue to be collected at the curb - cut in length not to exceed four (4) feet, securely tied in bundles and not weighing more than forty (40) pounds. Our recycling scope is unchanged, they are not accepting glass. A more detailed description of these services is on our website, www.countryvillagehoa.org.

Tennis Committee

The Board of Directors has reviewed the work of the Tennis Committee including bids, budgets, and contractor for the reconstruction of the tennis courts. The Board of Directors has determined a special assessment is appropriate to fund this work and has called a Special Meeting for February 3rd to seek approval. Look for the official notice of the meeting which includes the scope of work, budget and approval documents.

Community Center

Improvements are being planned to both the grounds and the clubhouse this year. Upcoming topics include updating the Clubhouse interior and furniture, improving the grounds, and the potential addition of a dedicated dog park, walking path, and/or pavilion. We also want to relocate the storage shed so the basketball court can be refurbished. To aid in these efforts a dedicated committee for the Community Center revitalization project(s) has been established. If you would like to participate in this committee please contract Corrie Kennelly or Kris Low.

Playground

There are parts of the playground equipment that need repair. They are not serious issues but the Board wants to address them as quickly as possible. The replacement parts have been ordered but we do not expect delivery until March 2022 or shortly thereafter. Once the parts have been replaced, the park border will be straightened, the ground filler will be replenished and the equipment power washed. Thank you for your patience.

Future Activities

Save the date: OCTOBER 4, 2022: Amanda Seiler, Corrie Kennelly and Sarah de Haas are working on organizing National Night Out. For Texas, NNO is held on the 1st Tuesday in October. It will be held at our clubhouse/park area. If you would like to volunteer please contact Corrie Kennelly. More details will be coming. Please check the CV website for any updates: countryvillagehoa.org. Corrie, Amanda, and Sarah are working together on a couple of other events which are not finalized. These events are separate from the events organized by Laura Payne and her talented group.

Pool

Our swimming pool will be open Memorial Day weekend, during the summer until Labor Day and each weekend in September. American Pool will again be the pool operator. We are also pleased to welcome the Villagers Swim team back to the pool this year. They will use the pool for practice during the evenings in May and mornings in June. Please note for safety reasons, the pool will be closed to residents when swim team practice is in session. A flyer with additional pool details including operating hours, rules and safety updates will be published in the spring. This year the pool area will have new umbrellas and tables.

Kirkwood Project Update

Kirkwood Paving and Drainage Project update

Traffic has been rerouted to the east side or north bound lanes so the Contractor can demolish and rebuild the street and sidewalks on our side (west side) of the street. They are installing a new 16 inch water line before rebuilding the street. The contractor is working from south to north, i.e. Highgrove to Riverview. The entire project is scheduled to be complete April 9, 2022.

Irrigation systems: The contractor is required to repair/replace individual irrigation systems and interior drain lines of all residents that go through the curb that are damaged as they install the new sidewalk and curbs. Residents are encouraged to take pictures of the existing systems to help the contractor with the restoration.

Mailboxes: Residents were notified in June 2018, that changes in the road required their mailbox, which is in the City's right of way, to be relocated and replaced. The replacement is similar to a typical black mailbox on a wood post. There will be no cost to the Owner. The City has advised if the resident wishes to build a new brick mailbox they may do so at their own expense.

Street lights: New street lighting is included in the project. Street lights are installed by CenterPoint and will be done at the completion of the entire project.

If you are planning on travelling this holiday season and would like to have the Constable put a vacation watch on your house, please go to the Precinct 5 constable website (www.Constablepct5.com) and download the form. While you are on the website you can look over the other programs that the Constable offers. I took the "Citizens Police Academy". It was extremely informative and enjoyable.

Sadly, crime continues and our lawn and garden contractors and homeowners are easy prey for theft of equipment. Please remind them to watch their equipment. During the year we have many residents enjoying the outdoors and walking the streets of CV, please be observant of your surroundings...if something does not appear right, please call the Constable. The Constable can typically respond in 5-10 minutes, so please call. If you are the victim of a crime, call the Constables, they will respond faster and inform the neighborhood of the crime in a timely manner. HPD does not send out crime alerts, so if you are the victim and HPD responds the only way we would know about it would be for the victim to pass along the information.

We encourage all our dog owners to pick up after them and properly dispose of their waste. Of course, absolutely no pets are allowed in the playground or pool areas.
