



### August 5, 2018 Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time John 6:24-35

Dear St. Pius X and St. Anthony Church Family,

Peace! "Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life..." (Jn 6:27). What a statement from Jesus for us to pray about every day. He is warning us not to give our lives over to foolish pursuits and fruitless projects that do not satisfy our eternal souls with enduring fulfillment. Often we may work so hard for something that we think is exactly what we need, and after achieving it, it fails us, not measuring up! We think we can't live without it, and as we receive it, we realize it doesn't come across with the result we imagined! Maybe it was a toy or new gadget, a new home, maybe an award-promotion or maybe even a person in our life. But after getting what we 'wanted', then we discovered, we still had the same problems (maybe even added new ones). We are still frustrated in the end, and 'looking for peace in all the wrong places'. Jesus might say to us, "Welcome to being human in a fallen world!" Jesus knows us and our disappointments, as we try to find peace without Him. A couple of weeks ago in the gospel we heard that he looked upon the crowds as 'sheep without a shepherd' (Mark 6:34). Sheep looking for food, security and belonging without a shepherd will never find it. Until the good shepherd comes along: Jesus. Try as we will, we finally must all come to face and admit our disappointing shortsightedness and the futility of our selfish grasping after our own wants and desires. Psalm 62:2 says "My soul rests in God alone". If you have ever been to Gethsemane Abbey, KY (Thomas Merton's home), you have likely seen the plaza-like area in front of the Church that has a prayer garden side entrance with a cast-iron gate and letters above it saying all that is needed: GOD ALONE. For it is in God alone, that we find the serenity and contentment we seek. And Jesus tells us that in today's gospel when he says, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst" (John 6:35).

But, being human, we do torture ourselves with 'too good to be true' propositions all the time (and the advertising industry is eager to help us in the torture). A great book needing to be written could be titled, "Let Us Tell You What You Want" to expose how false advertising plants impossible to satisfy desires and unreal needs into our hearts that only bring discontent and anxiety. Jesus is aware of such distractions and calls us all the more to come to Him, to find the rest and salvation He alone brings. The Devil tried to sell Jesus the 'easy way out' both in the desert and in the garden before his death, so He understands what it feels like to be promised the world and given nothing, or be promised the 'gold mine' and only get the shaft! Hebrews 4:15 says about our loving Savior that, "We have a high priest who is able to sympathize with our weaknesses, because he has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin." So, let us go to Him, Jesus, the One!
