Lincoln Northeast Inducts 15 Charter Members of the National Business Honor Society

On October 26, 2017, fifteen Lincoln Northeast juniors and seniors were inducted into the National Business Honor Society; it is just the second chapter in Nebraska and the first in Lincoln.

Lincoln Northeast business teachers, Jocelyn Crabtree, Jeff Fagler, David Mercer, and Deb Wolken started the application process in late 2016. The formal application was submitted to the National Business Education Association (NBEA) in January, 2017.

The application and review process is very thorough; among the requirements, all business teachers must be committed to becoming members or continue membership of the national association and pay annual dues. The Governing Council of the NBEA also scrutinizes the school's course offerings to be sure a comprehensive business education is offered to our students. We received notice several months after the formal application that Lincoln Northeast was selected as a chapter.

As the 2017-18 school year started, the selection process of initiates began with invitations to junior and senior students who had completed at least three business courses or were in their third business course. Students were to have a minimum of a 3.0 overall GPA and a 3.5 business GPA. Students completed applications and fifteen students were selected to be charter members.

Because students will be enrolling in new business courses at the beginning of each semester, plans include continuing to invite and induct members each semester.

Once the initiates were chosen, students applied to the four officer positions. Members selected the following officers: President--Rana Aribi; Vice President—Huda Abudu Nasab; Secretary—Abby Kudym; Treasurer—Valentina Fowler.

Other charter members include Thomas Brennan, Jennifer Hidalgo-Romero, Molly Houser, Heidi Jones, Jacob Meyer, Abby Neill, Nancy Nguyen, Hannah Ochsner, Ryan Secord, Taylor Swenson, and Aaron Wulf.

Call for Papers (Submission Deadline: May 1, 2018)

Mountain-Plains Business Education Association (M-PBEA) invites business educators to contribute articles for publication in the *M-PBEA Journal*. Manuscripts should deal with topics of interest to educators at both the secondary and post-secondary/collegiate levels. Authors must be members of NBEA to publish in the M-PBEA Journal. Additional information about the journal and past editions can be found at www.mpbea.org.

Submission of manuscripts dealing with practical topics is encouraged, as are research based or theoretical papers. Manuscripts should be original—not under publication consideration or previously published by another journal or professional work.

The theme for the 2018 Journal is

Action Research: Innovative Practices in the Business Education Classroom

Action research is a broad research technique used to evaluate an existing practice to improve a process. It is often used in education to improve the learning process. Teachers collect data on an activity they use in their class and then analyze the findings in an effort to revise the activity to better align with the learning objectives. Action research is ideal for teachers to better inform their own practice and to share their findings with other educators.

When submitting a manuscript, please follow these guidelines:

- Submit manuscript electronically as an attachment using Microsoft Word.
- Manuscript should be 6 to 10 double-spaced pages (including references which do not have to be on a separate page) of Times New Roman 12 pt. font.
- Include a separate information page (not included in the 6 to 10 pages) containing the article title, the complete names of all authors, their titles, employment, and contact information (mailing address, e-mail address, telephone numbers).
- Include tables and graphs only if they are essential to the content. These should be electronically formatted and included in the body of the article.
- Include all references cited in APA format.
- Do not use headers, footers, or page numbers.
- Include a 50 – 100 word abstract.

A review board will blind review manuscripts submitted for consideration and will determine those that will be included in the publication. The editor reserves the right to edit all manuscripts accepted for publication.
