## Trip Report: El Pauji, The Escalera and Rio Grande/Imataca (Estados Bolivar TropicalBirdPhotos and Delta Amacuro), Venezuela

## 10<sup>th</sup> - 21<sup>st</sup> November 2007 (David Southall)

This report covers highlights (images, some contact details and a trip list) from a trip to south-eastern Venezuela ... a more detailed report will follow. The trip concluded with a personal total of some 303 confirmed species, including 54 "first time ever" species to add to my Venezuelan list. This included a total of 24 Hummingbird, 24 Antwren/Antbird/Antshrike, 13 Cotinga/Piha/Bellbird and 9 Manakin species. The number of Antwrens/Antbirds/Antshrikes was far more than I have ever seen or photographed on a single trip and a direct result of putting my newly acquired iPod into action for the first time.

One footnote for distances along the Escalera Road: The former road signs along the Escalera Road (as referenced in e.g. my March 2006 trip report) have been replaced with signs giving the distance not from El Dorado but instead from Puerto La Cruz. Hence San Isidro (formerly marked as km 88) is now at km 713, the Piedra de la Virgin (formerly marked as km 98) is now at km 723 etc.

Logistics for the trip with David M-K and Tom to the Escalera and El Pauji were planned directly with the posadas; we travelled in David M-K's car. Tony and Rita Crease helped show us the many sites around El Pauji during our 4+ days there. Confirmed personal sightings only for DJS – excludes birds heard only unless otherwise indicated [those confirmed on site by comparison with iPod playback]; in order of appearance on the plates of Hilty's 'Birds of Venezuela'. David McLachlan-Karr and Tom Cullinan saw a few additional species, as did Tony & Rita Crease in El Pauji and Henry Cleave on the Escalera.

In addition, we saw a Giant Anteater (*Myrmecophaga tridactyla*) crossing the Santa Elena-El Pauji road prior to dawn (close to the end of the asphalted section); an agouti (*Dasyprocta leporina*) and Tayra (*Eira barbara*) on the side road we birded on our way to El Pauji; another Tayra crossing the Escalera road prior to dawn; and several agouties on the Rio Grande trails.
