

FROM THE PASTOR

November 11, 2018
 Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time
 Mark 12:38-44

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church Family,

Thumbs up or Thumbs down! It's now a simple internet expression, like swiping right or swiping left, to express approval or disapproval. Jesus sits across from the Temple treasury collection point and observes donors, and he gives a positive thumb up to a generous poor widow (Mk 12:43). But He gives a disapproving thumb down to the greedy scribes (verse 40) and the miserly rich who only gave leftovers (verse 44). Jesus commends the poor widow who gives out of a heart that genuinely trusts God. She simply drops in her gift with no show of bells & whistles, and trusts God to provide for her. Jesus had previously exposed the crafty scribes who paraded around in public making a display of themselves, seeking praise from others. In the background, a poor little widow makes her trip to the Temple treasury and deposits her two little coins (likely, a pension of some sort). Jesus says she is the example to follow; she gives without any consideration of reward or recognition, or even calculating the personal cost. The widow knows God will provide for her. She trusts God to create a way for her simple needs to be met!

Like a first century version of a financial auditor, it sounds like Jesus may be recommending the widow for the position of financial secretary for the company of the apostles! Considering what is going to happen with Jesus' first treasurer, Judas (*John 12:6 "Judas said this not because he cared about the poor but because he was a thief and held the money bag, to steal the contributions"*), I bet this poor widow not only became a disciple of Jesus, but also had a leadership role on His Board of Trustees. The converted Zachaeus (Lk 19:5) and apostle Matthew (Mt 9:9) would also make a good financial team of worthily responsible and charitable servants with Jesus' mission work. They know their numbers. But their most important qualification to serve as manager of Jesus' resources, is that they know by experience Jesus Himself, their merciful savior! The most valuable work experience on their resumes was not any business class or degree, it was the firsthand personal and life-changing encounter they had with Jesus.

The widow woman raises the question of one's attitude in giving. More than just whether one wants attention for their gift or not, I think her free generosity in giving all she had, reveals that she has the joy of God in her heart. Everyone would have understood even if she gave nothing (being without family and on a fixed income, if any). But what does she do? She gives all that is in her hand that day! She had an inner security that freed her to be able to give sacrificially. Those two coins may have been her lunch money for the week. Yet she gave them because she knew her God, and knew that He had given them to her once, and if she really needed them, God could give them to her again through the caring generosity of someone else. The widow woman reminds me of 2 Corinthians 9:7, "God loves a cheerful giver." St Paul is saying more than 'God loves a giver'. He says God loves a **'cheerful'** giver. God most desires the **'cheerful'** part. We can give out of guilt or pity, forcing us to let go of money, but how much more blessed is it to give because we love and know the joy of God in our heart. Pictures of sad faces, or needs thrown up in front of us can pry some coins out of our hands, but when we have the love of Christ in our hearts, our giving is spontaneous and free. I like 1 Corinthians 13:3, where St Paul speaks about the **irrelevance of the size of gifts, large or small, when compared to the spirit of giving behind them.** He writes, **"If I give away everything I own, and even hand my body over so that I may boast but do not have love (in my heart), I gain nothing"**. The love in the 'giving' heart is where God is glorified. God is not more glorified in high dollar amounts or great monuments built, but He is glorified in the humble heart whose gift is motivated by sheer love of God! This heart gives because it knows God and knows God is with it, and that God has brought it to where it is today and will continue to provide with or without human treasures. The heart's true treasure is in 'knowing Jesus'. Having that treasure, frees one to let go of anything to serve God, or as Alanis Morissette sings in her song "Thank-You", "The moment I let go of it, Was the moment I got more than I could handle." St Paul calls God's treasure 'what No eye has seen, no ear has heard, no human heart even imagined.' (1 Cor 2:9).
