Introduction

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Chapter 1: The Concert

Love and joy...joy and love...two words that cannot be separated in the lives of God's children. Yet this truth seems to be a contradiction in the world we live.

Two brothers were given FREE tickets to the concert of a great musician. When they arrived, the first brother was overwhelmed with joy, amazed and in awe of his good fortune, and humbled to be able to attend such a desired event. The second brother, however, did not seem pleased at all. "The seats are too far from the stage, the people around us are too noisy, and the music is too loud!" said the second brother. After the concert, a great banquet was held for the musician. The musician stood at the door of the banquet greeting all who came to enter. The first brother, brimming with joy, was the first to meet the musician, and the musician could see the passionate love in his eyes. The first brother was welcomed into the banquet with open arms. The second brother, still distracted by the concert's conditions, was the next to meet the musician. The musician could tell that the second brother was displeased and could find no love or joy in him. With a heavy heart, the musician told the second brother he could not enter the banquet, because he had never really listened to or understood his music.

I tell you the truth, not all who are invited or even all who think they have accepted the invitation will enter the Kingdom of God. The two brothers represent those who claim to be our brothers and sisters in Christ. The free tickets represent the gift of salvation offered to all, something that cannot be earned, bought, or bartered for, but only accepted through grace, faith, and repentance. The concert represents this world and our short troublesome life in it, where there will be constant distraction drawing our eyes, ears, and hearts away from the great musician. The great musician is Jesus Christ, and his music is the Word of God. Lastly, the great banquet represents the Kingdom of Heaven, which must be entered through the narrow gate. Jesus himself states, *"Not everyone who calls out to me, 'Lord! Lord!' will enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Only those who actually do the will of my Father in heaven will enter.* *On judgment day many will say to me, 'Lord! Lord! We prophesied in your name and cast out demons in your name and performed many miracles in your name.' But I will reply, 'I never knew you. Get away from me, you who break God's laws."* (Matthew 7)

Jesus teaches that we will know people including false prophets by their fruit. *"You can identify them by their fruit, that is, by the way they act. Can you pick grapes from thornbushes, or figs from thistles? A good tree produces good fruit, and a bad tree produces bad fruit. A good tree can't produce bad fruit, and a bad tree can't produce good fruit. So every tree that does not produce good fruit is chopped down and thrown into the fire. Yes, just as you can identify a tree by its fruit, so you can identify people by their actions." (Matthew 7)*

Though we ALL face hard days, weeks, maybe even years in our lives, help us to keep our eyes on you Lord. Give us Heavenly wisdom so that no matter how devastating a trial may be, our faith and trust remain in you. And let nothing steal our joy and love! In Jesus' name I pray, AMEN!

Chapter 3: The Great King

Some in the crowd were so distracted by the angry and jealous mob that they never even listened to or understood the Great King's offer. And lastly, some in the crowd lived wealthy and comfortable lives and said, "This Great King's offer is not worth our trouble, so we will settle for what we have made for ourselves", and they turned away and went home ignoring the splendor of his Kingdom.

But there were some in the crowd who DID accept the Great King's offer. They yelled back to the King with excitement, "We accept your gift and will follow you to your Kingdom!" And those who accepted were filled with joy over their good fortune and the generosity of the Great King! To all who accepted the Great King's offer, he gave a gold medallion and said, "This is my gift, and it will be the mark upon you of my offer and your acceptance so that the gatekeepers will know that you belong to me." Those who accepted the offer and the Great King began their journey back to the Kingdom from which he came, but the road was difficult and troublesome. Some said, "This journey is too hard, we were better off before!", so they gave back their gold medallions to the Great King, then turned away and went home. As the Great King and crowd approached the angry and jealous mob, those with him said, "Look, there isn't anything to fear from this mob, they have come to greet us!", but the Great King warned, "Follow me and stay close, so that you do not become lost in the mob!" As the Great King and crowd passed through the mob, they offered every type of pleasure including beautiful men and women, comforts and luxuries, and everything pleasing to the eye in trade for their medallions. Some in the crowd were so distracted that they left the Great King's side and became lost in the mob, and other traded their gold medallions for what seemed pleasing at the time.

Just after passing through the mob, the Great King and crowd reached the narrow gate of the Kingdom. The Great King passed through, and the crowd gathered in behind him to follow. The gatekeepers checked each one and let pass those who still wore the gold medallion as a mark of the Great King. But those without the gold medallion were stopped and not allowed to pass into the Kingdom. They yelled through the gates to the Great King and cried, "We followed you; we accepted your gift and want to join you in the Kingdom!" But the Great King replied, "Where are your gold medallions? You valued the pleasures of the mob more that you valued me! For my yoke was easy to bear, but you never loved me, and I declare today that I never knew you!" And among all of those who were not allowed to enter, there was bitter weeping and gnashing of teeth. For they could see the Kingdom but never enter it, they had met the Great King but could no longer feel his presence, and they had known his gift of true love but traded it for pleasures that last only a moment.

To make clear the many facets of this parable, I will explain only this one at length. The "Great King" represents our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and the "Kingdom" represents the Kingdom of Heaven. The "crowd" represents the people of this world who are seeking their purpose in it. The "angry and jealous mob" are the many people who don't love Christ and are filled with anger, jealousy, hatred, and rebellion of every kind that is inspired by the prince of this world, Satan. We must all pass through the mob on our journey to the Kingdom of Heaven, and Jesus Christ is the light illuminating our path to that Kingdom. Jesus has offered salvation and a home in the Kingdom to ALL who will accept and follow his teachings. Jesus explains, *"Don't let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God, and trust also in me. There is more than enough room in my Father's home. If this were not so, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? When everything is ready, I will come and get you, so that you will always be with me where I am." (John 14)*

But some are so fearful of not conforming to the world or standing apart from it, that they will abandon God's offer and the Way, Jesus Christ. Others believe the Word of God to be nothing more than a fairy tale; a story to inspire false hope and control people with its message. They cannot imagine a supreme Creator caring for or desiring a relationship with ordinary people, so they ignore the message in disbelief. Some will be so distracted by this difficult and worrisome life, that they will never take the time to understand God's Word or his message of hope through Jesus Christ. And lastly, some will be so comfortable and consumed by their possessions and luxury, that they will be deaf to God's truth and blind to the magnificence of his creation. They fear they might somehow upset or disrupt their good fortune, and in turn, they disregard wise teachings. The Apostle Paul warns, "But God shows his anger from heaven against all sinful, wicked people who suppress the truth by their wickedness. They know the truth about God because he has made it obvious to them. For ever since the world was created, people have seen the earth and sky. Through everything God made, they can clearly see his invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature. So they have no excuse for not knowing God. Yes, they knew God, but they wouldn't worship him as God or even give him thanks." (Romans 12)

To continue explaining, "those who did accept the Great King's offer" represents people who accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior and enthusiastically claim they will follow him. At first, they are filled with joy over finding Jesus, but all too soon, their faith and love in Christ are crowded out by the troubles of this world. The "gold medallion" represents the gift of salvation offered to us all through Jesus Christ. It makes us right in God's sight and worthy of entering the Kingdom of God. The "difficult and troublesome" road are the trials of this life that will cause some to turn away. There could be an untimely death of loved ones, sickness and disease, money troubles of every kind, wars and rumors of war, and oppression at every turn, BUT we must cling to and never lose sight of our Savior, Jesus Christ. We may not understand why some people seem so troubled and others so blessed, but it is not our place to question God's plan and unwise to turn away because of it!

"What sorrow awaits those who argue with their Creator. Does a clay pot argue with its maker? Does the clay dispute with the one who shapes it, saying, 'Stop, you're doing it wrong!' Does the pot exclaim, 'How clumsy can you be?' How terrible it would be if a newborn baby said to its father, 'Why was I born?' or if it said to its mother, 'Why did you make me this way?' This is what the LORD says—the Holy One of Israel and your Creator: 'Do you question what I do for my children? Do you give me orders about the work of my hands? I am the one who made the earth and created people to live on it. With my hands I stretched out the heavens. All the stars are at my command.'" (Isaiah 45)

Those in the parable that "became lost in the mob" represent the people who

become lost in the distractions, chaos, and pleasures of this world. They trade their love and faith in Jesus Christ for worry and doubt, hatred and unforgiveness, jealousy and selfishness, sexual perversions, and all kinds of sinful pleasure. "Just after passing through the mob" represents the passage of our life in this world into the next, and the "narrow gate" represents the way to Heaven. Jesus declares, *"You can enter God's Kingdom only through the narrow gate. The highway to hell is broad, and its gate is wide for the many who choose that way. But the gateway to life is very narrow and the road is difficult, and only a few ever find it."* (Matthew 7)

From the parable, "those who still wore the gold medallion" represent the people who accepted Jesus Christ in faith as their Lord and Savior, and in turn, their love and faith were proven by the change in their lives, actions, and by doing the will of our Father in Heaven. Jesus says, "Not everyone who calls out to me, 'Lord! Lord!' will enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Only those who actually do the will of my Father in heaven will enter." (Matthew 7) "Those without the gold medallion" represent the people who put themselves and their own selfish desires first, even though they claimed Jesus as their Lord. There was no change in their lives, actions, or obedience to the instruction of our Father in Heaven. Again Jesus explains, "On judgment day many will say to me, 'Lord! Lord! We prophesied in your name and cast out demons in your name and performed many miracles in your name.' But I will reply, 'I never knew you. Get away from me, you who break God's laws.' "Anyone who listens to my teaching" and follows it is wise, like a person who builds a house on solid rock. Though the rain comes in torrents and the floodwaters rise and the winds beat against that house, it won't collapse because it is built on bedrock. But anyone who hears my teaching and doesn't obey it is foolish, like a person who builds a house on sand. When the rains and floods come and the winds beat against that *house, it will collapse with a mighty crash.* (Matthew 7)

Will we be perfect children of God through Jesus Christ? NO, we will all fall short of the standard set by our Heavenly Father. But through repentance, God will see the love we have in our hearts for him. "Christians" who have no remorse for their sins and disregard God's laws are the ones in jeopardy of trading their salvation for the pleasures of this world. And finally, there will be "weeping and gnashing of teeth" by those who ignored, put off, did not take the time to understand, or traded their salvation for this world. I can only imagine the terror and unthinkable horror of having such a magnificent gift within reach, yet turning away and focusing on a life that will be here today and gone tomorrow.

May God's message and the explanation of this parable open the hearts and minds of ALL who find it, so that we can join him in the splendor of his Kingdom once this short and troublesome life is over. In Jesus' name I pray, AMEN!

Chapter 4: The Last Call

I will tell you a truth that God has revealed to me about himself and this ministry. This truth is about God's love of irony in his plans and purposes. One definition of irony is "a state of affairs or an event that seems deliberately contrary to what one expects and is often amusing as a result". Those who are familiar with the Holy Bible will know these ironic stories well, so I will list only a few.

- Jesus, the one and only perfect son of God, our Lord and Savior, and the man in which God gave all authority in Heaven and Earth, was laid in a manger when born, not in a palace or place of luxury.
- The twelve apostles Jesus chose to be his students and closest to him were not experts in religious law or those who held respected positions at the temple. Fishermen and a tax collector were some of their occupations before being called by Jesus to follow and help start the Christian church.
- The apostle Paul, who was called on by Jesus miraculously to spread the Good News, was a man on a mission to hunt down and persecute all of followers of Christ that he could find!
- When Gideon led the Israelite army of 32,000 against a Midianite army numbering 135,000, God told Gideon that the Israelite army was TOO LARGE! Once God had shrunken down the Israelite army to only 300 men,

THEN God made Gideon's small army victorious over the vastly larger Midianite army.

 And who could forget John the Baptist, the cousin of Jesus who was called to prepare the way for Jesus' ministry. John was not a powerful leader in society or highly esteemed member of the temple that you might have expected God to use. John was a man who lived alone in the wilderness and wore a garment of camel's hair with a leather belt. He ate locusts and wild honey to survive and called other religious leaders who came to witness baptism a "brood of vipers"!

The point of this truth being that God will again prepare for the coming of Jesus (his return). Will God use a mighty Christian church or well-established Christian organization to proclaim Jesus' second coming? Will God use a highly esteemed man who has been well educated in religious law to prepare the way? Or might God use a small and relatively unknown ministry to reach and prepare God's people? A ministry untainted by the business mindset and pleasing of people that many churches conform to, today.

Just as God used John the Baptist's ministry to prepare the people for the first coming of Jesus, I believe God has created this ministry for a specific time and purpose as a precursor to the second coming of Christ. A ministry that will serve as a LAST CALL for believers around the world to prepare their hearts before Jesus' return. A time for the bride to be made ready for the Bridegroom, without spot or blemish.

May God prepare us with wisdom and understanding for the second coming of Christ. And may all who find this message know in their hearts to prepare, because the time of our Lord will be soon, suddenly, and unexpected. I pray for these things in Jesus' name, AMEN!

Chapter 5: The Three Wanderers

There was a rich man who encountered three wanderers in his travels. In his compassion for others, he made the three wanderers a gracious offer! He told them, "I have a mansion with many rooms, but it is not near to you. This

mansion is 1000 miles away, and you must begin your journey now by foot. Leave behind your troubles and join me in the splendor of my mansion, and I will be waiting there for you. I have prepared a map to show you the way, and I have even written notes on the map to guide you through the many dangers you will encounter. Also, I give you this purse of gold that will provide you with all provisions needed for your journey." After these instructions were given, he gave them the map and purse of gold and then left their company.

Now one of the wanders considered himself strong, another considered himself to be wise, and the third wanderer simply considered himself fortunate to receive such an offer. So, the three wanderers began their journey by foot as instructed by the rich man.

As they followed the narrow path marked on the map, they did encounter many dangers! But the notes provided by the rich man always guided them safely through. Then one day, they came to a mighty river alongside the narrow path whose water flowed opposite to the direction they were heading. The man who considered himself strong said, "The water of this river is crystal clear and beautiful to behold, so I will go down into it to bathe and be refreshed." But then one of the other wanderers replied, "The map warns us to stay on the narrow path, or else we may lose our way!" But the man who considered himself strong and went down into the river to bathe anyway. Once he was waist deep, he realized the current was much stronger than he had assumed and was swept away and lost by the strength of the current.

Afterwards, the two remaining wanderers traveled on much further and came to a great city alongside the narrow path. The great city had every comfort and luxury imaginable and was very pleasing to the eye. The wanderer who considered himself wise said, "I am tired and weary from this long journey, so I will take my portion of the gold from the purse and stop here for a while to rest." But the other wanderer replied again, "The map warns us to stay on the narrow path, or else we may lose our way!" But the man who considered himself wise ignored the warning and took his share of the rich man's provision into the city to purchase luxuries, comforts, and everything pleasing to the eye. Once he had gone into the city, the temptation and lure were too great, and he remained in the city for the rest of his days.

The third and final wanderer, who considered himself only fortunate, traveled on much further and finally arrived at the mansion of the rich man. The gold in the purse provided by the rich man had been just enough for everything needed on the journey. The rich man came out of his mansion to greet the wanderer, and the wanderer fell to his knees in thankful humbleness before the rich man. The rich man then asked, "Where are your companions?", and the wanderer replied, "They were lost along the journey, because they did not heed your warnings." The rich man replied, "I tell you the truth, many have set out for this same magnificent destination, but few will reach it. For those who trust in their own strength or wisdom will surely perish, but those who heed my warnings and follow my instruction will find me. For the thankful, the humble, and the meek will inherit all that I have to offer." Then the rich man embraced the wanderer, as they continued into his mansion for a great feast!

Chapter 6: Reorganization of the Church

I share a vision that I believe God gave me for the church. A design and blueprint for the reorganization of the church to better serve God and his people. In this vision, I could see...

- There was a centrally located place of worship for multiple communities (a community tabernacle) that was designated and made accessible for all within a reasonable traveling distance. This tabernacle was an abandonment of the many separate places of worship in the same or even close communities that we see today.
- The tabernacle was a place where the day chosen as the Sabbath was a true DAY of rest and worship by the people. A place where the tabernacle was open the entire day for God's people to come and go, enjoy meals together, hear sermons at various times, sing songs of praise, and hear the scripture of the Holy Bible read frequently while they listened, worshiped, and prayed.

- The abandoned (for worship) churches were repurposed as Christian schoolhouses where those who could pay to attend do, but those who cannot come freely. Pastors were leading and guiding those who taught and worked at each schoolhouse. The schoolhouse was a place where children could come and learn what is truly needed to be successful in both worldly jobs AND their relationship with God. A place where love, compassion, and comfort from God's people could be instilled in our children EVERY day. A place where those who do not want to come and learn, be respectful, and build a relationship with God aren't legally bound to do so. And a place where teachers are appreciated for the incredibly important role they have... nurturing the hearts and minds of God's children and ultimately our future leaders.
- The tithes and offerings of the people were combined to maintain the tabernacle, maintain the Christian schoolhouses, bless those in need, bless Israel, and bless mission workers abroad. And the tithes and offerings were not collected or plead for. But instead, a time was set aside for the people to bring the offerings that God put on their heart, in which God himself looked over and examined, and in which the people themselves brought forth with joy, praise, and true thankfulness.
- There was a high council of pastors with rotating sermon duties who presided over the tabernacle as its leaders. This council was responsible for organizing tabernacle resources, Christian schoolhouses, and helping with the needs of the people. There was an obligation to forge bonds with other community tabernacles for mutual support. There was an election held every 3 years for each high council seat by a vote of the people. And the people brought their quarrels to the council for judgement and obeyed its decree, instead of a man-made and godless legal system.
- And finally, an ornate hand-crafted wooden chair by the talented wood workers of the community was built and placed on an elevated platform above but close to the High Council's table. It remained unused in honor and remembrance of our Savior's return. A single light always illuminating it...day and night.

I have served in many roles as ordained by our Father in Heaven, including a

son, a brother, a husband, a father, a servant, a messenger, and today possibly one more... an architect for the restructuring of the Christian church. I pray that if this vision is truly accurate, God himself will stir the hearts of the people and pastors for change. By the power and authority of Jesus' name I pray, AMEN!

Chapter 7: The Golden Shackles

There was a man who lay outside the gate of a magnificent city, held there by golden shackles around his wrists and ankles. Each day, a wise and generous host would come to the gate of the magnificent city and call out to all who would listen saying, "The weary will find rest, the weak will find strength, and the broken will find comfort, love, and peace when they enter my city!" The shackled man was all of these things and longed to enter the magnificent city, but no matter how hard he pulled, he could not break the chains that bound him. As the shackled man lay outside the gate, he watched as the children, the meek, the poor, and the humble walked by and entered the magnificent city. They were each greeted by the wise and generous host as they entered.

As time went on, the shackled man grew older and suddenly died one day. He then found himself standing outside the gate of the magnificent city, and the wise and generous host met him there asking, "Why did you never come to me and enter the city when I called? I called out to you every day and welcomed you in, but you never listened! Today I declare, I never knew you...and your home will not be with me in this magnificent city. Despair and regret will be the home in which you dwell, far from me." The man who had been shackled then cried out, "Lord, Lord, I heard your call and wanted to come! But I was bound by the golden shackles and chains which I could not break!" Then the wise and generous host replied, "Look there, the golden shackles that kept you bound were not even locked! I tell you the truth, the choice was always yours to accept my invitation or remain bound by the golden shackles, but your love of money kept you chained. Now depart from me, you who practice iniquity."

This parable of the golden shackles teaches the meaning of Jesus' statement, "*I* tell you the truth, it is very hard for a rich person to enter the Kingdom of Heaven. I'll say it again—it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a

needle than for a rich person to enter the Kingdom of God!" (Matthew 19) The golden shackles are the riches and luxuries of this world that constantly distract and hold us back from a healthy relationship with God. Even though the choice is always ours, many leave their hearts and minds bound by worldly desires and won't let go of these chains. May God open our eyes and help us recognize what keeps us from praying regularly, from reading his Word in the Bible, from helping those around us, from being a reflection of God's love, and from sharing the Good News about Jesus Christ! And help us to hear and listen to your call, Father God. In Jesus' name I pray, AMEN!

Chapter 8: Unknown Event

7/7/2019 – On the 7th second, of the 7th minute, of the 7th hour, of the 7th day, of the 7th month, of the 7th year of the next decade, which will be 7 decades since the State of Israel was proclaimed, 7/7/2027@07:07:07 CDT (3:07pm in Israel)...

Close to 8 months ago, I woke up in the middle of the night restless and feeling like God had a new message for this ministry. I have received and written several messages for this ministry in the same manner, but this time I heard only a date and time. Dates and times of things to come have been reported erroneously or misunderstood many times by others, and I have struggled with whether to share what I heard in my Spirit. Since that time, I have had constant reminders and have not been able to put aside this date. So today, exactly 8 years until that day, I share it through this ministry. If I knew the meaning of this date and time, I would tell you. But whether it is the beginning or ending of something, or possibly some special event in God's eyes, I feel peace now that I have shared it. For those with ears and discernment, the date occurs on the 12th year of this ministry, and my number is 8.

UPDATE 9/20/2023: While fasting and praying this previous week, I felt God nudging me to re-examine this message. When originally posted, I simply used the common calendar shared by my own and many other countries which is the Gregorian calendar. The countdown timer on the ministry website has now been adjusted to mark the date and time on the Hebrew calendar being the 7th day of Tishrei (3 days before Yom Kippur). The 7th hour now also reflects the 7th hour as it would have been known in Jesus' time which is 1:00pm (John 4:52). This new date and time of 7/7/5787@13:07:07 on the Hebrew calendar equates to 9/18/2026@05:07:07 CDT on the Gregorian calendar.

These are the questions I heard...

How many times must a wayward son ask his father for something, before the father is inclined to act. In comparison, how many times would a favorite son who is perfect in all ways need to ask his father for something, before the father is inclined to act, even when pleading FOR the wayward son?

Whose ears have more compassion for a wayward son? Would it be a disappointed father, or a brother who has walked in our shoes and suffered in the very same ways that we have?

These are the reasons that we should pray to the Son, Jesus Christ, and the reasons he is willing to go to the Father on our behalf and plead our case. Who did the thief, hung on the cross beside Jesus, ask for help? Was it the Father or the Son? Who answered his plea so quickly with grace, mercy, and understanding? You will not upset the Father by asking help directly from the

Son, because the Father has given all authority in Heaven and Earth to the Son. Lifting our prayers to the Son brings glory to our Heavenly Father who sent him!

Separately, I felt like God was describing the battle with our great enemy, satan, who is the prince of this world. Who is satan, but another wayward son of the Father. Satan is like an older brother burning with envy and jealousy, because his younger brother (man) has found favor with the Father and will inherit the larger portion normally given to the firstborn.

Chapter 23: The Gift Bearer

Chapter 24: Importance of Fasting

The practice of fasting is presented in the Holy Bible for different reasons. Sometimes it is to show honor and reverence to the Lord, sometimes it is a sign of remembrance, and still sometimes it is during times of great hardship or anguish. But what is gained from a sacrifice such as fasting? How does it affect or improve our relationship with the Lord when stripping away earthly pleasures and necessities? The answer is simple, but not obvious to most. When denying ourselves food, one of the basic pleasures and necessities of life, we discover the condition of our heart. When denied food, are you consumed with hunger, frustration, anger, and lack of love or mercy for others, or do you still praise the Lord and love others? Even though the Lord always knows the condition of our heart, we sometimes convince ourselves otherwise through conditional acts of loving others, showing kindness, and praising the Lord only when all our own worldly pleasures and/or necessities are being met. But without pleasure or even necessity, you will see clearly for yourself the condition of your own heart as God sees it. And in this stripping away of earthly fulfillment, you will discover your shortcomings and weaknesses in the eyes of the Lord. If "good people" do terrible things to others when faced with hunger, what does that say about the condition of their heart? People may use excuses like "survival instinct" to justify their actions to themselves, others, or even God, but I tell you the truth, anything contradictory to love is both displeasing to and not from the Lord. Some may read this and say that there are parts of the Holy Bible that contradict showing love to others, but I tell you the truth, any form of loving people is always superseded by obedience to God (loving God with all your heart, soul, and mind being the GREATEST commandment). To conclude, denying yourself the pleasures, comforts, or necessities of this world will unmask the true intentions and condition of the heart.

When led by the Holy Spirit, you should fast for a time based on guidance from the Lord. Along with being an opportunity for reverence, remembrance, or favor in times of trouble, it will be a revelation of the condition of your heart to yourself and even others. You will discover what the Lord already knows about the condition of your heart, and this knowledge can be used to improve the condition of your heart through awareness, and in doing so, improve your relationship with God. Let those with ears hear, and understand, and share what God has spoken into their spirit. By the power and authority of Jesus' name, I pray. AMEN!

Chapter 25: The Good Father

How are there still so many misconceptions about the way to Heaven? As Jesus taught, teachers of religious law continually come up with new rules and regulations to enter Heaven, which have not come from the Father and which they do not even keep themselves! How terrible it will be on the day of judgement for all who have been misled, but even more terrible still for those false teachers. (Matthew 23)

Salvation is like a Good Father with many children, who wanted to prove just how dearly he loved them. So when the right time came for each of them to learn to drive, he was careful to teach them everything they needed to know to be safe. In Jesus' own words, "A good tree produces good fruit, and a bad tree produces bad fruit. A good tree can't produce bad fruit, and a bad tree can't produce good fruit. So every tree that does not produce good fruit is chopped down and thrown into the fire. Yes, just as you can identify a tree by its fruit, so you can identify people by their actions. Not everyone who calls out to me, 'Lord! Lord!' will enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Only those who actually do the will of my Father in heaven will enter. On judgment day many will say to me, 'Lord! Lord! We prophesied in your name and cast out demons in your name and performed many miracles in your name.' But I will reply, 'I never knew you. Get away from me, you who break God's laws." (Matthew 7)

Chapter 26: Love Your Enemies

A world filled with hate, anger, no compassion, no mercy, and no forgiveness has truly strayed as far as possible from the teachings of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. And the people of this world have determined that they are capable of being its judges, a self-righteous people that are ready and willing to cast judgement on all of God's glorious creation themselves. I tell you the truth, the shame and spiritual debt that the judges of this world will accumulate in God's eyes will truly be great and horrifying on that most wonderful day when you stand before our Heavenly Father, the creator and one true judge of all creation. Will we live as God intended and as Jesus taught AND LIVED during his earthly ministry, or conform to worldly practices of declaring ourselves God and judge over this world and everyone in it? In the words of our greatest teacher pulled from pieces of the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said, "God blesses those who are merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Go and be reconciled to that person. Then come and offer your sacrifice to God. You have heard the law that says the punishment must match the injury: 'An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth.' But I say, do not resist an evil person! If someone slaps you on the right cheek, offer the other cheek also. If you are sued in court and your shirt is taken from you, give your coat, too. If a soldier demands that you carry his gear for a mile, carry it two miles. Give to those who ask, and don't turn away from those who want to borrow. You have heard the law that says, 'Love your neighbor' and hate your enemy. But I say, love your enemies! Pray for those who persecute you! In that way, you will be acting as true children of your Father in heaven. For he gives his sunlight to both the evil and the good, and he sends rain on the just and the unjust alike. If you love only those who love you, what reward is there for that? Even corrupt tax collectors do that much. If you are kind only to your friends, how are you different from anyone else? Even pagans do that. But you are to be perfect, even as your Father in heaven is perfect." (Matthew 5)

Ask, plead, even beg for God to examine your heart and open your eyes to the truth of its condition, so that you may be ready for that most wonderful day. IN LOVE, teach what is right and true according to the scriptures, and allow God time to convict the hearts of those who are not in a healthy relationship with him. Don't misunderstand what I am saying, for there will be judgement for all of God's laws that are broken and for those who mislead others regarding the

law, but that judgement and punishment will come from the only one qualified to do so, our Father and Creator in Heaven. And those who break the laws of this world, whether aligned with God's law or not, will surely be subject to the authority of this world, as well.

But when the third young sparrow learned to fly, it immediately flew far from the Good Farmer's porch determined to experience all that the wilderness had to offer. After much time had gone by, the Good Farmer knew that the third young sparrow was not coming back, and there was sadness in the Good Farmer's heart. Each day though, the Good Farmer would still call out into the wilderness hoping to see the third sparrow return, but the sparrow's choice was its own.

Chapter 30: Baptism

What is the purpose of baptism, who should be baptized, and when should you be baptized? These questions are common among those who are new in their faith and relationship with Jesus Christ.

Baptism is a beautiful and visual representation of the death and burial of our sinful life along with the resurrection and beginning of a new life in Jesus Christ. This is a declaration to all who witness that you have put your faith in Jesus as Lord and Savior and that you are ready to start your new life of loving (obedience and respect for) God and loving (kindness and compassion for) others. Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist and instructed all of his followers to do the same when he said, *"I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (Matthew 28)*

Who should be baptized then? In this quote from the Book of Matthew, Jesus indicates that ALL disciples (followers/students) from ALL nations should be baptized. There is no one excluded by Jesus from this instruction, so ALL brothers and sisters in Christ should feel confident in beginning their journey

through baptism.

When should you be baptized? This is probably the question that followers and even leaders within the churches of Jesus Christ struggle with most. Did Jesus say that disciples must fully know, or fully understand, or be fully practicing everything that he had commanded before being baptized? No such pregualification was given and should not be added when a person hears the Good News and wants to be a follower of Christ. A new disciple will not be welltrained in all the teachings of Jesus Christ, and they will certainly not have mastered obedience in their walk with Christ. Becoming a disciple indicates the beginning of your walk with Christ, the start of your desire to be obedient to Christ's teachings, and the beginning of your journey in this new life (not the completion of that journey). New disciples will struggle and even fail in their obedience to Christ, just as those who have followed Jesus for DECADES sometimes struggle and fail in their walk with Christ. There is no record in the Bible of anyone being turned away, being asked to go home and think about it, or being asked to study scripture before they are baptized, because baptism is ordained by God and not men, organizations, or churches. Three thousand examples of this principle were given by the Apostle Peter, "So let everyone in Israel know for certain that God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, to be both Lord and Messiah! Peter's words pierced their hearts, and they said to him and to the other apostles, 'Brothers, what should we do?' Peter replied, 'Each of you must repent of your sins and turn to God and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Then you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. This promise is to you, to your children, and to those far away all who have been called by the Lord our God.' Then Peter continued preaching for a long time, strongly urging all his listeners, 'Save yourselves from this crooked generation!' Those who believed what Peter said were baptized and added to the church that day—about 3,000 in all." (Acts 2)

This desire to follow Jesus Christ in general does not come from within a man and is not taught from one man to another. The desire to follow Jesus, the Son of God, comes from our Heavenly Father as he draws their spirit as Jesus described, *"For no one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws them to me, and at the last day I will raise them up. As it is written in the* Scriptures, 'They will all be taught by God.' Everyone who listens to the Father and learns from him comes to me." (John 6) Therefore, what man, organization, or church can declare themself the gatekeeper between a man who desires baptism and the Kingdom of Heaven? What man, organization, or church can say to another man that "you are not ready for baptism", when God himself draws them with the desire to come and follow Jesus?

Ask, plead, even beg for God to examine your heart and open your eyes to the truth of its condition, so that you may be ready for that most wonderful day.

Let those with ears hear, and understand, and share what God has spoken into their spirit. By the power and authority of Jesus' name, I pray. AMEN!

Chapter 31: The Free Meal

A priest, a pastor, and a rabbi were debating God's will for the church while walking down the street to find lunch. When they passed by a small restaurant, the owner stepped out to offer them a free meal, so the three teachers felt blessed for their good fortune. As they went in, the owner greeted each man and took their jackets before seating them at one of his finest tables.

Promptly after seating them, the owner asked what type of sandwich each man would like. The first and second teacher told the owner what they wanted, and the third asked that his sandwich be wrapped up and given to the homeless man outside the restaurant with specific instructions to tell him who sent it. Which man in the story best represents Jesus?

I tell you the truth, the man in this story who best represents Jesus' character was the restaurant owner. While many men have dedicated their lives and careers to teaching the Good News about Jesus, some have misrepresented the character of Christ. The character of Jesus is not proud, or boastful, or demeaning, or judgmental, or self-serving. Jesus has instructed us to be full of love and compassion for one another, to meet each other's needs, and to serve others. He has offered us the bread of life and drink that can quench any thirst, if only we accept it and follow him. And Jesus himself has declared loving others as important a commandment as loving God!

Who does your character best represent? Is your character born of the ideas and plans of men, or the true teaching of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ?

"Before the Passover celebration, Jesus knew that his hour had come to leave this world and return to his Father. He had loved his disciples during his ministry on earth, and now he loved them to the very end. It was time for supper, and the devil had already prompted Judas, son of Simon Iscariot, to betray Jesus. Jesus knew that the Father had given him authority over everything and that he had come from God and would return to God. So he got up from the table, took off his robe, wrapped a towel around his waist, and poured water into a basin. Then he began to wash the disciples' feet, drying them with the towel he had around him. When Jesus came to Simon Peter, Peter said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" Jesus replied, "You don't understand now what I am doing, but someday you will." "No," Peter protested, "you will never ever wash my feet!" Jesus replied, "Unless I wash you, you won't belong to me." Simon Peter exclaimed, "Then wash my hands and head as well, Lord, not just my feet!" Jesus replied, "A person who has bathed all over does not need to wash, except for the feet, to be entirely clean. And you disciples are clean, but not all of you." For Jesus knew who would betray him. That is what he meant when he said, "Not all of you are clean." Chapter 33: The Seven Sisters

There was a rich man who had seven daughters, and he taught them everything he knew about the ways of God but also the world. While his daughters were still young, he was taken away unexpectedly, and his daughters were left with only his instruction on how to live successful and full lives.

As the seven sisters reached a proper age for marriage, they each found a suitable spouse and were married. The first sister relied on her intelligence in worldly matters, and she had wealth and a successful business of her own. The second sister relied on her beauty and caught the attention of many suitors. The third sister relied on her charm and could ease almost any situation. truly believe God is telling me it is even bigger than that. Comparison, if left un-checked in our lives, will dictate our actions, feelings, and even shape our future including our relationship with God. We should understand that comparison is the root of evil and that it must be avoided to the very best of our ability, so that our relationship with God can prosper. If someone told you they could give you one word that was the root of practically every problem in your life including frustration, jealousy, envy, anger, depression, and unhappiness would you listen? Would you use this knowledge to change?

The first sin by a human ever recorded was when Eve in the Garden of Eden sinned due to her desire for more knowledge, when inspired by Lucifer's temptation to compare her knowledge to that of God's. Lucifer himself fell into this trap of temptation and path of darkness. He dared to compare himself to God which inspired the prideful actions that led to his fall. If Lucifer had fought his urge to compare and simply chosen to be the best he could be for God, he might still be one of the most powerful angels in heaven. Cain compared God's acceptance of Abel's offering to the rejection of his own leading him down the path of darkness which ended in him killing his own brother. Be mindful and guard your thoughts when you see television, Facebook, friends, co-workers, and even family including their possessions, actions, and accomplishments. **Do not compare...**God has beautifully orchestrated a **different path and purpose for** each of us to work in harmony and to the benefit of each other for His glory! If certain things in our lives are triggers for comparison, let us realize this through wisdom and understanding from God so that we may guard our thoughts and urges to compare, in Jesus' name I pray. AMEN!

Case and Point:

How better can I give a case and point of this truth than to describe it using my own life? My father, who was one of the kindest men I have ever met, fell ill and passed unexpectedly when I was 35 years old. I do wonder why it was his time and certainly miss him, but I have chosen to be thankful. I am thankful for having him in my life for 35 years and all of the great memories I have with him. I could compare my father's seemingly early death with that of other fathers I know who are well past that age, I could compare my life to friends and family who still enjoy time with their fathers, I could compare my father's kindness to that of men who seem to have none and live much longer, but these are all paths to spiritual darkness. I don't claim to understand why some seem so blessed while others seem so unfortunate, but I know God has a beautifully orchestrated plan for each of us. Our sinful nature will distract us from our own special plan with the temptation to compare our lives to others, and this temptation is always present in everything that we do. The moment you begin to compare is the moment you begin the journey into darkness.

I plead with all who find this message to **stop comparing** and spare yourselves from the problems that it creates in your life and relationship with God, and may we be successful together in doing so, in Jesus' name I pray. AMEN!

Path of Darkness:

Comparison leads to Pride / Judgement / Frustration / Jealousy / Envy / Boasting / Anger / Depression / Unhappiness which are all on the path to spiritual darkness.

Path of Light:

Do not compare...Be the best YOU can be for God **without comparing** your possessions, actions, or accomplishments to anyone else's possessions, actions, or accomplishments. Be thankful to God for all he has blessed you with each and every day without comparison, and God will turn your life into a beacon of light as bright as the sun to shine glory, praise, and honor upon himself and his son, Jesus!

Chapter 35: The Sun

How better to describe the glory of our Father in Heaven than to compare his glory to the most prominent of lights, the sun. The sun, only one small part of God's creation, is vastly more than most of us can imagine. The sun shines so brightly, that a blind man can feel its intensity and knows its presence, even without sight. The sun is constant, and no one questions whether it will fail, or disappear, or no longer exist within their lifetime. Each day when the sun rises, the birds sing, the darkness is illuminated, and people feel refreshed and renewed after sleeping. The light and warmth of the sun bring life and growth to every plant needed to feed this world. And like the intensity of the sun, harm would come to anyone who looked directly at God or got close physically, in this life.

If the Father is like the sun, then how could the Son of Man be compared? The moon, the second greatest body in our sky is easily comparable. Like the Son, the moon is even closer to the people. The moon can come between the sun and the people (solar eclipse) like an intercessor, and when the sun forsakes the moon and does not shine on it (lunar eclipse), the moon becomes red and is called a "blood moon", similar to the time around the crucifixion.

The stars that fill the night sky could be compared to the angels in Heaven, the prophets of old, or anyone that works in this life to spread the Good News about Jesus Christ. Like bright lights in a dark and dying world, let those who have accepted the Son of Man become a beacon of hope, joy, and peace leading towards our Lord and Savior, before it is everlastingly too late.

Could the sun, moon, and stars be a continuous parable from God displaying his plan and design for salvation through Jesus Christ? A story that all could see playout time and time again which repeats for every generation until our Lord's return and mocks all who would ignore the evidence for God and his Son that surrounds us daily.

A few references to the sun and moon from scripture to think on...

"Immediately after the anguish of those days, the sun will be darkened, the moon will give no light, the stars will fall from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then at last, the sign that the Son of Man is coming will appear in the heavens, and there will be deep mourning among all the peoples of the earth. And they will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of heaven with power and great glory." (Matthew 24)

The way we prioritize our life speaks volumes about our love for Jesus Christ and our willingness to follow his example. If we were to order the priorities in our lives without the wisdom and guidance of God, the list would look much different than the list above. Maybe it would look more like the list below:

- 1. Myself
- 2. Work
- 3. Children
- 4. Spouse / Friends (depending on your mood)
- 5. Extended Family

The point being that "myself" doesn't even make the list if you were to model your priorities like Jesus did. Jesus was **selfless**, always putting the needs of others first, going as far as to lay down his own life for those that did not know or love him and even those who hated him. Which list of life priorities more closely resembles our own? Have we followed the example given by Jesus Christ, our perfect Lord and Savior?

It would be a lie if I claimed that my life priorities matched the first list perfectly. Knowing how we should live and actually following through can be very difficult sometimes, although I do strive with my whole heart to have the right life priorities. With help and wisdom from God, we can all achieve the correct ordering of our life priorities, and in doing so, we will please God and bring great glory and honor to him and his son, Jesus Christ!
